SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Reckless Discharge of a Firearm

On November 5th officers were dispatched to the Drakeshire Apartment complex for a report of possible gunfire in the area. Upon arrival, officers spoke with management who advised that they had heard several gunshots outside and when management went outside to check she heard another gunshot and a man run into one of the buildings. Officers located the man who denied firing any weapon, stating that some friends of his had fired their gun in the air in order to test it. The man did not know his friends' names and management did not see anyone else in the area. Officers located several empty casings in the parking lot next to the man's car. Officers interviewed the man's girlfriend and she advised officers that there was a gun in the apartment. Officers took custody of the firearm and noticed that it was the same caliber of the empty casings from the parking lot. The man provided a false name to officers and was issued a citation for the violation. Officers noted that the man's birthday was November 5th and note that the shots were most likely fired into the air. No witnesses observed the man fire any gun, so the firearm found in the girlfriend's apartment was confiscated and will be compared to the empty casings that were located in the lot. The case is still open pending laboratory comparisons of the firearm.

Burglary

On November 5th at 3:01 AM officers were dispatched to an alarm at the Colonial Oil Change on Nine Mile Rd. Upon arrival officers noted that a window had been smashed out and money was stolen out of the cash drawer. Colonial Oil had surveillance video of the incident which showed a black male driving an older model sedan break into the building and steal the money. On 11/10/2020, the man and an accomplice were arrested by a neighboring police department. Both suspects admitted to the Farmington crime.
