SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Soliciting without a license

On November 23rd an officer responded to the area of Brittany Hill and Grand River Ave for a report of a man going door to door soliciting money. Upon arrival the officer located the man who advised that he was going door to door asking for money because he is homeless. The man has been previously warned about his aggressive begging so he was cited for solicitation.

Carbon Monoxide Leak

On November 24th officers responded to a home on Meadowlark for a report of a carbon monoxide alarm activation. Upon arrival officers detected dangerous amounts of carbon monoxide coming from the gas stove. Gas to the stove was turned off and the home was cleared of all carbon monoxide. The homeowner was advised to have his stove serviced by an authorized repair service.

Attempt Fraud

On November 24th a Robinwood resident reported that a family friend's Facebook page had been hacked and the hacker had sent the resident a message offering to help her with finances. The resident noted that the hacker connected the resident with an Agent from the Department of Health and Human Services who offered the resident a sizeable financial grant if the resident provided her personal information. The resident suspected that she was being scammed so she did not provide the information.

Larceny from Auto

On November 25th an officer responded to a residence on Flanders St. for a report of a larceny from auto. Upon arrival, the officer learned from the victim that several tools were stolen from the victim's

unlocked truck. The victim does not know who stole the tools and the incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Flee and Elude

On November 27th an officer on patrol attempted to stop a vehicle in the area of Nine Mile and Farmington Rd. for driving without insurance. As the officer activated his emergency lights, the suspect vehicle sped up and drove through a red light. The officer pursued the vehicle to a home on Heathersett Crescent Rd. in Farmington Hills where the driver began honking his horn. The driver was taken into custody and admitted that he fled the officer because he was afraid of the police. The driver does not have a driver's license and had several warrants for his arrest. The driver was held at the Farmington Jail and is charged with fleeing and eluding and never acquiring a driver's license.
