SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Larceny

On October 14th two residents from the Warner Farms subdivision reported that their political signs were stolen from their front lawns. The homeowners did not know who stole their signs.

Suspicious Person

On October 15th an officer responded to the 23800 block of Colchester for a report of a suspicious phone call. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the home owner who advised that she had received a phone call from an unknown male who stated that the home owner's computer has been compromised. The home owner hung up on the male and he immediately called back. The homeowner hung up on the male because she suspected that he was trying to scam her. A report was filed.

Carrying a Concealed Pistol

On October 18th an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River Ave and Drake Rd for an improper lane use violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had been drinking alcohol. The driver failed several sobriety exams and submitted to a preliminary breath test with a result of a .28 BAC. The driver was arrested for operating while intoxicated. Upon conducting an inventory search of the driver's vehicle, the arresting officer located a Glock 9mm pistol hidden inside a hat on the driver's side floorboard. The driver does not have a concealed pistol license, but the pistol was registered to him. The driver was charged with carrying a concealed pistol and OWI.
