SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Disorderly Complaint

On September 7th an officer was dispatched to a report of a possible destruction of property at Mayfield and Slocum. Upon arrival the officer learned that a 17 year old Mayfield resident had fire several paint ball rounds from a paint ball gun at the construction equipment and then went inside his home. The officer confronted the 17 year old who admitted to firing at the equipment and advised that he had no reason as to why he did. The teen’s paintball gun was confiscated and the teen was cited for disorderly conduct.

Fraud

On September 12th an Alta Loma resident reported at the police front desk that he was the victim of a fraud. The elderly man advises that his computer had frozen up and a warning screen displayed advising that his computer had been compromised. The warning display purported to be from Microsoft Corporation and provided a phone number to call to remedy the error. The man called the phone number from the warning display and spoke to a female with a slight accent. The woman advised that the man would need to provide \$300 in Ebay gift cards to the woman in order for her to help him. The victim purchased the gift cards and provided the female with the card numbers. The woman advised the victim that there was no money on the card, so he would have to purchase a separate gift card from Nike in order to pay for the service. The victim purchased several other gift cards to a total loss of \$2,300 before he realized that he was being scammed. The victim had fallen for a common ransomware scam where the suspect is able to infiltrate the victim’s computer and place a virus on it. The incident was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigations.
