### SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

#### Fraud

On January 25<sup>th</sup> a Farmington Hills resident reported that her Chase Bank account had been fraudulently attacked and over \$1,000 withdrawn. The victim advised that she had received an email from Chase Bank stating that she had given access to an unknown person named "Dave" which had resulted in the fraudulent withdrawals. The victim advised that she never gave anyone permission to access her accounts and Chase has reversed the charges.

#### Attempt Fraud

On January 25<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to the Jamestown Apartment complex for an attempt fraud report. Upon arrival the officer learned from the complainant that he had received a phone call from a man who claimed to be from an unknown utility company. The man offered to lower the complainant's utility bill if the complainant provided the man with his credit card number. The complainant did not fall victim to the attempt and a report was taken.

#### Attempt Counterfeiting

On January 29<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to the Zap Zone on Grand River Ave for a report of a subject attempting to pass a counterfeit bill. Upon arrival the officer learned from an employee of the business that a young female attempted to pay for items with a \$100 bill. The employee immediately noted that the money was counterfeit and handed it back to the female, stating it was fake. The female paid for the items with a legitimate \$50 bill and left the scene. A report was taken.
