FELONY WARRANT OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT (11-4842)

On September 12th, an officer observed a vehicle to be straddling the lane marker on eastbound Grand River near Drake Road. The officer conducted an LEIN check on the plate and registered owner. The owner had an outstanding felony warrant out of the Romulus Police Department for Larceny. The officer observed the driver to match the descriptors in the warrant. The officer conducted a traffic stop with the vehicle at Grand River/Halsted. The driver was arrested on the warrant and turned over to the Romulus Police Department at Eight Mile and Haggerty. Also located in the vehicle was a ladies wallet containing an identification, WIC card, Social Security card and health care card belonging to a third party. The wallet was confiscated. Follow up investigation revealed the wallet and contents were stolen in a home invasion in Detroit. The Detroit Police Department was advised and a copy of the report was sent to them.

LARCENY OF GAS (11-4872)

A resident from the 36000 block of Heatherton reported that sometime between 3:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on September 12th, his gas can was taken from his garage from which the overhead door was up.

OPEN BURN COMPLAINT (11-4874)

On September 13th, a resident in the 32000 block of Lee Lane reported that a neighbor may be burning trash in their backyard. The responsible resident was located and found to be burning wood. The resident was advised and the fire was extinguished.

MINOR IN POSSESSION (11-4878)

On September 14th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling 32 mph on westbound M-5 near Farmington Road in a 70 mph zone. A traffic stop was conducted at Grand River and Halsted. The driver was eighteen years old and claimed the speedometer was broken on his vehicle. The officer observed an unopened six pack of Mike's Hard Lemonade behind the passenger seat. The

driver denied possessing the alcohol. The driver was issued a citation for Minor in Possession and released from the scene.

MEDICAL (11-4880)

On September 14th, at 8:32 a.m., officers responded to Fitness 19 on a medical. Upon arrival, a witness was performing CPR on a sixty-seven year old male that had collapsed during his workout. Officers arrived quickly and attached the department's Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) to the patient and administered two shocks. CPR was continued and shortly after a pulse was present. Community EMS arrived and assisted with advanced life support protocols and transported the patient to Botsford Hospital.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-4897)

On September 15th, an officer stopped a vehicle for disregarding a red light at Grand River and Halsted. The officer followed the vehicle and observed it cross the center lane, weave within its lane and change lanes without signaling. Upon making contact with the female driver, the officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver admitted to drinking at a friend's house and failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .16(7). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated and refused a Datamaster breath test. A search warrant was obtained and her blood drawn and sent to MSP for alcohol analysis. The driver was cited for Operating While Intoxicated, 1st offense.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING (11-4891)

On September 14th, staff of Farmington Village Apartments reported that over the weekend someone entered the common office area and stole bank deposit bags containing checks and cash.

VEHICLE FIRE (11-4894)

On September 14th, a resident in the area of Nine Mile and Floral Street reported a possible vehicle fire at a neighbor's residence. Upon arrival the vehicle fire was already extinguished by the owner via a garden hose.

FELONY WARRANT OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT (11-4904)

On September 15th, at approximately 10:30 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on eastbound M5 near Farmington Road for having an expired plate. The passenger of the vehicle had three felony warrants out of the Oakland County Sheriff's Department and the Sterling Heights Police Department. The subject was arrested and transported to our lockup where he was processed and held awaiting pickup.

OPEN INTOXICANTS IN A MOTOR VEHICLE (11-4913)

On September 16th, an officer observed a vehicle weaving within its lane and straddling the center line on westbound Grand River near Halsted. A traffic stop was conducted on eastbound M-5 near Halsted. The officer detected an odor of

intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle and the driver admitted to having two shots of alcohol. Writer had the driver perform field sobriety tests with passing results. A consent search of the vehicle yielded a one-half full cup of Hennessy Cognac behind the front passenger seat. The officer issued a citation to the driver for Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle and released the driver from the scene.

UNLAWFUL ENTRY OF GARAGE (11-4924)

On September 17th, a homeowner in the 32000 block of Marblehead reported an unauthorized person(s) had entered his unlocked garage between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 11:55 p.m. on September 16th. The owner returned home to find the garage door open and the light on. It also appeared the subject went into the garage attic. The owner reported nothing missing and no damage to the garage. No suspects at this time.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-4925)

On September 17th, an officer observed a vehicle disregard the red traffic signal at Ten Mile Road and Orchard Lake. The officer conducted a traffic stop at Ten Mile Road near Middlebelt. Upon making contact with the driver the officer detected an odor of intoxicants in the vehicle. The driver admitted to having several glasses of wine at a friend's residence. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .12(4). An inventory search revealed an open bottle of Dewar's Scotch Whiskey behind the driver's seat. A breath test at the station revealed a BAC of .12. The driver was issued a citation for Operating While Intoxicated and Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle and released upon sobriety.

ASSIST OTHER AGENCY (11-4937)
