ASSIST OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT (11-5115)

On September 27th, at 9:00 a.m., this department assisted the Oakland County Narcotics Enforcement Team with a search warrant at Kensington Manor Apartments.

STRUCTURE FIRE (11-5124)

On September 27th, at 12:45 p.m., officers responded to a house fire in the 36000 block of Heatherton. A landscape company employee was mowing the lawn next door and observed light smoke coming from the home. Officers arrived to find a small fire in the living room. The fire was quickly extinguished.

Subsequent investigation revealed that a scrapbooking tool was left on in the basement igniting paper and other materials. The fire then burnt a hole into the living room on the first floor. The fire caused minimal fire damage to the home.

SOLICITORS (11-5126)

On September 27th, officers were dispatched to the Bel-Aire Subdivision for a report of two teens soliciting without a permit. Upon arrival officers located the teens who were handing out free copies of the Detroit News in order to solicit new customers. The teens were not in violation of the city ordinance and did not need a license.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-5130)

On September 27th, at approximately 9:46 p.m., an officer conducting traffic patrol in the area of Grand River and Halsted observed a vehicle exit the Shell gas station cross three lanes of traffic on Halsted Road and start heading northbound in the southbound lane. The vehicle then stopped and attempted to back up into the northbound lanes. A traffic stop was made and the subsequent investigation revealed that the driver was intoxicated and drank a couple of beers in Livonia and a tall glass of wine at his home in Farmington Hills. The driver

was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated and had a blood alcohol content of .09.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING (11-5156)

On September 29th, a manager of a Papa Johns came into the police department to report the following: Papa Johns had just received notice from the Kroger Corporation that a check written from Papa Johns to a former employee had just been cashed after it had initially been returned for insufficient funds. The manager advised that the check was initially written in November of 2010 and was cashed in September of 2011. The manager advised that the check was initially written in error and that the former employee should not have been in possession of it. The manager believes that the former employee stole the check from the office of Papa Johns and waited until now to cash it.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE (11-5165)

On September 30th, at 12:09 p.m., officers responded to Drakeshire Apartments for a family trouble. Upon arrival, officers made contact with the boyfriend and girlfriend who both reside in the apartment and interviewed them. The girlfriend stated that her and her boyfriend got into a verbal argument and he started to break things within the apartment. The girlfriend slapped her boyfriend across the face two times. The boyfriend gave a similar account of the argument and as a result, the girlfriend was arrested for domestic violence.

CUSTOMER TROUBLE (11-5186)

On October 1st, officers were dispatched to the Big Lots store in the Uptown Plaza for a report of an unruly customer. Upon arrival officers interviewed the customer who advised that he has had problems shopping at this Big Lots in the past and on today's date he had called the store to complain about the poor customer service he had received while shopping for a chair. The customer had a heated argument with the assistant store manager who advised the customer to come up to the store. The customer took this challenge as a threat, so he decided to go into the store in order to confront the assistant manager.

Officers spoke with the assistant manager who advised that he had attempted to satisfy the customer over the phone when the customer began calling him names and swearing at him. At that point the assistant manager disconnected the phone call and soon the customer was at the store trying to get the assistant manager to exit the store into the parking lot. Per Big Lots, the customer was advised that he would be arrested if he returned to the store.

FELONY WARRANT OTHER JURISDICTION (11-5188)

On October 1st, an officer travelling west on Nine Mile Road near Gill observed a Pontiac in front of him with a loud muffler that was dragging on the roadway. The officer effected a traffic stop at Nine Mile Road near Drake and identified both occupants. A LEIN check of the passenger revealed a felony warrant for stolen

property out of the 36th District Court through the Michigan State Police. The subject was arrested and eventually turned over to the Michigan State Police.

FIRE ALARM (11-5189)

On October 1st, officers responded to the Farmington Civic Theater for a report of a fire alarm going off. Upon arrival officers learned from management that one of the photo sensors is faulty and that the smoke from the popcorn maker had activated the fire alarm accidentally.
