OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-5220)

On October 4th, at 2:09 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding on Grand River near Farmington Road. Contact with the driver indicated that the driver had been drinking. The officer administered field sobriety test, which the driver failed, and was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated. A subsequent breath test confirmed that the driver's BAC was .14.

EMBEZZLEMENT (11-5223)

On October 4th, Jet's Pizza advised that one of their drivers went out for two deliveries and never returned with the money that evening. A telephone message was left with the suspect and the matter was resolved the next day.

FAMILY TROUBLE (11-5229)

On October 4th, at approximately 5:55 p.m., officers were dispatched to a report of a possible strong arm robbery in progress at Brookdale Condominiums. Dispatch advised that a female called 9-1-1 to advise that a black male had just taken her purse and took off from Brookdale Condominiums towards the American Legion. Upon arrival officers learned that the black male and the female caller had been in a dating relationship at one time but that the relationship was over. The male was at the female's home visiting and was going to borrow some money when an argument began over the female possibly dating another man. During the argument, the male snatched \$30 out of the female's purse and left. The female was uncooperative with officers during the investigation and does not want to press charges for the theft.

HIT AND RUN INJURY ACCIDENT (11-5233)

On October 4th, at approximately 10:00 p.m., a white Nissan or Infinity SUV attempted to exit the M-5 exit ramp at Nine Mile Road at a high rate of speed. The Nissan/Infinity loss control and struck the stop sign and "No Entrance" signs, crossed Nine Mile Road and then struck a motorist that was heading east on Nine Mile Road. The suspect vehicle then took off heading east on Nine Mile Road. The motorist who was struck was sent to the hospital with head, neck and hip injuries. The suspect vehicle should have damage to its front and driver's

side. The vehicle is a large SUV with tinted windows all around. The debris left by the vehicle indicated that it was made by Nissan, but Nissan also makes the Infinity brand of vehicles.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING (11-5236)

On October 5th, a resident of Farmington Oaks reported that unknown person(s) cut the locks to all four of his storage lockers and stole miscellaneous computer related items.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED II (11-5245)

On October 6th, at 2:56 a.m., an officer observed a vehicle northbound Halsted at Grand River at a red signal. Upon activation of the green signal, the officer observed the vehicle to accelerate rapidly causing the tires to squeal as it completed a left hand turn from Halsted onto westbound Grand River. A traffic stop was conducted at Grand River and Sinacola Court. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver initially denied consuming alcohol but later admitted to consuming one or two beers at a friend's residence in Farmington Hills. The driver failed field sobriety tests and refused a PBT. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). The driver refused a breath test at the station and a search warrant for blood was obtained. The driver had a previous conviction for OWI out of Novi in 2008.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED 11-5246

On October 6th, at 3:07 a.m., an officer observed a vehicle stopped in the ally to the rear of CVS. The vehicle was running and the officer pulled in to investigate as the vehicle pulled forward. Contact was made with the driver who was eighteen years old and stated she was waiting for a friend. The driver was noted to be intoxicated but denied drinking at all. The driver failed field sobriety tests and refused a PBT. She was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated. The subject did submit to a breath test at station with a result of .19 BAC.

PANHANDLERS (11-5264)

On October 6th, at approximately 9:15 p.m., a male and a female were asking for money in the parking lot of the Zap Zone. Officers detained the two and discovered that one had a traffic warrant out of the city of Detroit. Detroit did not want to pick up on the warrant and the subject was advised. Both individuals were advised of the city ordinance regarding panhandling and were released.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY (11-5269)

The owner of Farmington Bike Shop reports that sometime after 7:00 p.m. on October 6th, unknown person(s) apparently shot his glass door with a pellet gun shattering same.

SMOKE INVESTIGATION (11-5281)

On October 7th, at approximately 10:05 p.m., officers responded to the Valero gas station at Eight Mile and Farmington Road for a report of a light smoky haze

in the building. The investigation revealed a bad light ballast in the building that had caused the smoke.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING (11-5293)

On October 8th, at 3:35 p.m., a resident of Brookdale Condominiums reports that her ex-boyfriend stole her cell phone and prescription medications while at the condominium retrieving his belongings.

BROKEN WINDOW (11-5296)

While on patrol on October 8th, at 4:55 p.m., an officer located a broken window to the rear of an empty business in the Farmington Shopping Plaza. The window had been cracked for several years and had finally given way. The owner of the Plaza was contacted and informed of the damage.

STRONG ARM ROBBERY (11-5300)

On October 8th, at approximately 9:30 p.m., a nineteen year old man got off of the bus at Grand River and Orchard Lake. At the same time the man reports four subjects, two white males and two black males, attempted to get onto the bus but were turned away because they did not have enough money. The four subjects followed the man north on Orchard Lake Road where one of them stated to the man, "Where's the money blood?" and another stated, "Do you hear him talking to you bitch?" The man turned around and was confronted by the four subjects; a brief fight ensued between the man and the four subjects resulting in the four subjects running away towards Grand River Avenue. The man then called his family who persuaded him to call the police.

Responding officers investigated the incident and noted that the description of two of the subjects matched two subjects that officers knew lived in the area. A subsequent investigation at the home of two of the suspects revealed that the two white males were actually missing juveniles who officers returned home. Three of the four suspects admitted to being at the bus stop at the same time as the victim, and admit to being turned away at the bus, but they deny ever having contact with the victim. The incident has been turned over to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

INTOXICATED FEMALE (11-5301)

On October 8th, at approximately 10:40 p.m., a man contacted this police department requesting assistance in locating his twenty-nine year old heavily intoxicated daughter. The daughter had become upset with her parents who were trying to convince her to come home. The female was out walking in the area of Grand River and Drake. Officers located the heavily intoxicated female in the open field across from the 7-11 Store at Grand River and Drake. The female agreed to be driven home by an officer.
