RECEIVING AND CONCEALING STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLE/NEVER ACQUIRED LICENSE (11-5881)

A "Be On the Lookout" (BOL) out of Farmington Hills Police Department regarding a stolen vehicle, was distributed at roll call on November 14th. The BOL contained the description of the vehicle stolen from Independence Green Apartments on November 13th. An officer observed the vehicle at the intersection of Grand River and Halsted. A traffic stop was conducted at Grand River and Lamb Court. The driver denied knowing the car was stolen. The driver stated she got the key to the vehicle from a cousin. The driver did not know the registered owner of the vehicle. The driver was subsequently arrested for Receiving/Concealing a Stolen Motor Vehicle and Never Acquired. The driver was processed and housed pending warrant review by the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office.

WIRES DOWN (11-5894)

On November 14th, at 2:35 p.m., officers responded to wires down over a truck at Country Apartments. Officers found an Art Van truck had struck cable and phone line wires and same became stuck between cab and box. This caused the pole to come partially down at which time high voltage lines came in contact with the back of the truck trapping the occupants. Officers secured the scene and contacted DTE who arrived and was assisted by the Farmington Public Safety Department in removing the wires from the truck and rescued occupants.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE (11-5900)

On November 14th, at approximately 7:40 p.m., a resident of Lark Harbour contacted this police department because an unknown person had knocked on her door. The resident asked through the door several times who was knocking without any answer. Finally an unknown man spoke through the door and claimed to be a newspaper man. After waiting a few moments the resident opened the door and nobody was there. Officers checked the area but were unable to locate anyone and the resident never saw the man.

MARIJUANA POSSESSION (11-5904)

On November 15th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling westbound on M-5 near Farmington Road with an expired registration plate. A traffic stop was conducted on

M-5 near Drake Road. The officer detected an odor of marijuana coming from the interior of the vehicle. A search of the vehicle revealed a baggie (9 grams) of suspected marijuana in the center arm rest. The baggie was confiscated by the officer. The driver was arrested for Possession of Marijuana. The driver was processed and housed pending receipt of bond money or morning arraignment. The officer issued the driver a citation for Marijuana Possession and expired plates.

ATTEMPT LARCENY FROM AUTOMOBILE (11-5917)

On November 16th, at approximately 3:00 a.m., an officer observed a white male attempting to enter a van parked at the Colonial Car Wash. The officer made a u-turn and located the subject hiding under the van. The subject was detained and interviewed. The subject indicated the van belonged to a friend who owed him money. The officer observed fresh damage/pry marks on the passenger side door of the vehicle and a screwdriver was located in close proximity to the subject. The subject was arrested for attempt Larceny From Automobile (LFA). The screwdriver was collected as evidence and the van photographed. It was learned later that the name of the suspect was unknown to the owner of the van. The suspect was held pending warrant review by the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for attempt LFA.

CUSTOMER TROUBLE (11-5926)

On November 16th, at approximately 5:00 p.m., the driver of the Smart Bus called this police department because he had an irate customer who was refusing to pay. The driver stopped the bus at Grand River and Sherwood and waited for the police to arrive. Upon arrival, officers learned that the man had gotten on the bus and paid three dollars to the machine for a ticket. The driver believes that the man only put in two dollars and was trying to cheat the machine, but the man advised that he put in three dollars and the machine malfunctioned. The man put in another dollar prior to police arrival, but the driver advised that he wanted the man off the bus anyways. The man was refunded his ticket and waited for the next bus to arrive.

FAMILY TROUBLE (11-5938)

On November 17th, at 3:40 p.m., officers responded to Heeney-Sunquist on a report of a fight involving family members. First arriving officers found two people yelling at each other on Farmington Road in front of the business. Within minutes, numerous other family members exited the business and began arguing. Additional officers responded and were able to restore the peace. There were accusations of pushing and shoving as well as a possible assault that is currently being investigated.

RETAIL FRAUD (Shoplifting) (11-5956)

On November 18th, officers were dispatched to T.J. Maxx on a report of a shoplifter who had been arrested by store security. Upon arrival officers learned that the suspect had been seen by store security concealing a \$49 sweater in his pants after removing the security sensor off of the merchandise. The man was confronted at the front of the store and taken into custody. The man admitted to intentionally stealing the item and was arrested. Officers learned that the man is on parole with the State of Michigan for one count of Armed Robbery and two counts of Unarmed Robbery. The Michigan

Department of Corrections (MDOC) was contacted reference the parole violation and the man was turned over to MDOC via Oakland County Jail.

CIVIL MATTER (11-5967)

On November 19th, a Brookdale Street resident came to the station to report a civil problem with a contractor. The resident advised she hired a contractor who stated he was with Rock Construction. The suspect did only part of the work but had been paid in full. The resident later learned that the suspect had been fired from Rock Construction and was not bonded and had other complaints from other individuals about his work. An officer contacted the suspect who gave a contradictive story. The resident did not want him back at her home. The resident was then advised how to proceed with a civil suit.

OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF DRUGS II (11-5970)

On November 20th, an officer observed a vehicle on westbound Grand River near Brookdale following another vehicle too closely. The officer also observed the vehicle weave and cross the centerline. The officer conducted a traffic stop with listed vehicle on southbound Farmington Road near Alta Loma. The officer noted the driver to have glassy eyes and slow deliberate movements. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants and requested the driver to exit the vehicle for field sobriety tests. The officer interviewed the driver and learned the driver takes several pain medications. The driver failed the field sobriety tests and submitted to a PBT with passing results. The driver was arrested for Operating a Motor Vehicle Under the Influence of Drugs (OUID). The vehicle was impounded and a search warrant for blood was obtained. The blood was sent to MSP for examination. The driver has a previous Operating While Intoxicated in 2008. The report was forwarded to the detective bureau for warrant presentation for OUID, second offense.

BREAKING AND ENTERING OF A BUSINESS WITH FORCE (11-5972)

On November 20th, at 4:13 a.m., officers responded to a burglary alarm (rear motion) at Moy's Café located at 30746 Grand River. Upon arrival, the officers observed the business to be secure. An officer observed roof access via an adjacent fence and observed debris and insulation on top of same. A ladder was utilized to scale the roof where the officer observed a 2' X 2' hole in the roof. The business owners arrived and provided a key. The interior was searched with negative results. The owners noted nothing missing or disturbed. No entry was made by the suspect(s). The scene was turned over to the detective bureau for further processing. No suspects.

BREAKING AND ENTERING OF A BUSINESS WITH FORCE (11-5973)

Officers responding to a burglar alarm on an adjoining business discovered a 2' X 2' hole in the north wall of Maher and Associates located at 30748 Grand River. The officer noted the air conditioner on the north wall had been removed and pushed inside the business creating the entry point. The owner arrived and the business was searched. The owner reported nothing missing/disturbed. The owner utilizes the small 200' business to keep records. The scene was turned over to the detective bureau for further processing. No suspects.

CARRYING CONCEALED WEAPON (11-5977)

On November 20th, at 11:10 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation. While speaking with the driver, the officer observed a handgun in the driver's door. The gun was found to be a loaded .40 cal. handgun. The driver did not have a Carrying a Concealed Weapon (CCW) permit and stated he thought he could carry it once he bought it. The gun was confiscated and subject arrested and charged with CCW.
