NEVER ACQUIRED, FALSE IDENTIFICATION TO POLICE, FELONY WARRANTS

On December 12th, at 11:45 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding on Drake Road. The driver gave false identification and would not cooperate. The department Blue Check device was used for a fingerprint comparison and the subject's identity was determined. The subject had no driver's license and two felony warrants. The passenger was also found to have warrants for his arrest.

SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING FIRE

On December 13th, a resident of the 33000 block of Grand River Avenue called 9-1-1 because her bathroom was on fire. In less than one minute Farmington Public Safety officers were on scene. The fire was located in the upstairs bathroom and was quickly extinguished. It was determined that an old exhaust fan had malfunctioned and caused the fire. No one was injured at this incident.

WARRANT ARREST FOR OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

A resident of Chatham Hill's Apartments came to this police department requesting assistance in ending a relationship with her boyfriend. The resident advised that her relationship with the man had been violent in the past and she feared that if she ended the relationship without police assistance, the man would harm her. In addition, the man has moved into the resident's apartment and would most likely refuse to leave if she ended the relationship. A LEIN check of the man revealed six warrants for his arrest, including one out of the City of Farmington Hills. The resident allowed officers into her apartment where they located the man sleeping on the couch. The man was peacefully taken into custody for the warrants and advised that his girlfriend is ending the relationship. The man was turned over to Farmington Hills Police Department.

OPERATING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF DRUGS (OUID)

On December 14th, at approximately 2:00 a.m., an officer stopped a Yamaha Rhino all-terrain vehicle for driving on private property in a reckless manner. Upon stopping the vehicle the driver indicated that his garage was broken into and he was out looking for who had done it. In speaking to the driver, the officer noticed his behavior and speech to be slow. The driver denied drinking but stated he was on anti-depressants. The driver was put through field sobriety tests and failed. As a result, the driver was arrested for OUID.

The driver was transported to the station where he voluntarily submitted to a blood test. The driver was held until sober and arraigned.

OPERATING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF DRUGS (OUID)

On December 15th, at approximately 1:30 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle at Nine Mile and Farmington Road for stopping in the middle of an intersection at a red light. The vehicle was obstructing eastbound Nine Mile traffic as a result. Upon speaking to the driver, an odor of alcohol was noted and the driver's speech slurred. The driver completed field sobriety tests and failed. The driver submitted to a PBT with a result of .08(1). When questioned, the driver also admitted to ingesting pain medications and stated he was currently wearing a Fentanyl patch on his shoulder due to back pain. The driver was arrested and transported to the station where he submitted to a voluntary blood test. The driver was housed awaiting sobriety and then released.

ARCHING WIRE

On December 15th, at 4:52 a.m., officers were dispatched to Kim's Auto Care in the 32000 block of Eight Mile for a report of an arching wire next to a building with flames visible. Upon arrival, officers found an electrical wire that went from the utility pole into the building was arching where it entered the business. Officers determined nothing was on fire inside the business and contacted DTE and the business owner. DTE arrived shortly after and cut off the power to the business. It was determined by DTE to be a problem from within the building.

DRIVING WHILE SUSPENDED AND PAROLE VIOLATION

On December 16th, at 1:50 p.m., an officer handled a traffic crash report. During the investigation it was found one driver had a suspended license and was in violation of his parole. The subject was arrested and held for the State Corrections Department.

ASSIST OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

On December 17, at about 5:00 a.m., officers assisted a Farmington Hills officer on a felony traffic stop of a vehicle matching the description of a vehicle involved in reported "shots fired" in Greenhill Apartments. The two vehicle occupants were detained and a handgun was confiscated from the vehicle. Both occupants were arrested by Farmington Hills police.

PERSONAL INJURY ACCIDENT

On December 17th, at 1:40 p.m., officers responded to an injury accident at Grand River and Mooney. Both drivers suffered injuries and both were transported to area hospitals.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On December 18th, at 02:57 a.m., a midnight shift officer observed a vehicle traveling southbound on Drake Road at a high rate of speed (45 mph in a posted 25 mph zone). As the officer turned around and attempted to stop the vehicle, the vehicle accelerated to 60-70 mph on Freedom Road. The vehicle pulled into a subdivision and turned off its headlights. The officer stopped the vehicle as it pulled into a driveway. The officer made

contact and noted that the subject was visibly intoxicated. Field sobriety tests were administered and the subject was arrested for drunk driving. The subject was transported to the station where it was determined that the subject had a blood alcohol level of .19. The subject was housed until sober and until he posted bond.

ARMED ROBBERY

On December 18th, at approximately 7:50 p.m., a male walked into Jet's Pizza at Grand River Avenue and Orchard Lake and pointed a revolver at the cashier, demanding money from the business. The man threw a pillow case on the counter and took approximately \$300 in cash. The man fled on foot towards Orchard Lake Road. Officers responded to the scene and quickly noted that the same suspect had robbed a Little Caesar's Pizzeria in Farmington Hills approximately a half hour earlier. While investigating the crime, officers learned that the same suspect committed another armed robbery at a pizza place in Southfield and then again at another pizzeria in Farmington Hills. The man and his accomplices were located by Farmington Hills police and were arrested.
