



## WEEKLY REPORT

January 2 - 8, 2012

### **MARIJUANA ARREST/NEVER ACQUIRED**

On January 2<sup>nd</sup>, an officer stopped a vehicle for failing to dim their bright lights at Eight Mile/Chesley. The driver could not produce a license and admitted to never acquiring one. The driver was arrested for Never Acquired. A search of the vehicle yielded a small amount of marijuana in a clear plastic vial in the driver's purse. The officer confiscated the vial. The officer issued a citation to the driver for Possession of Marijuana and Never Acquired. The driver was held pending receipt of bond money or morning arraignment.

### **SOLICITORS**

On January 2<sup>nd</sup>, at approximately 4:30 p.m, officers were dispatched to a report of a solicitor going door to door for a window company in the Floral Park Subdivision. Upon arrival, officers locate the man on Violet Street going door to door who advised that he was soliciting for Performance Windows and Doors. The man did not have a City of Farmington solicitor's permit. The man was checked through the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) and it was discovered that he had a misdemeanor warrant for contributing to the delinquency of a minor out of Westland. The man was arrested on the warrant and cited for soliciting without a permit. The man was turned over to Westland police.

### **SOLICITORS**

On January 2<sup>nd</sup>, at approximately 4:50 p.m., officers responded to the Warner Farms Subdivision for a report of a solicitor going door to door for a window company. Upon arrival the officers located a man on Hayden Street going door to door for the Hanson's Window Company. The man admitted to not having a City of Farmington solicitor's permit and he was cited for soliciting without a permit.

### **FIRE ALARM**

On January 2<sup>nd</sup>, at approximately 9:39 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Zap Zone on Grand River Avenue for a fire alarm that had been pulled. Upon arrival the staff advised that they had been having problems with some juveniles causing disturbances who the staff believed may have pulled the fire alarm prior to leaving. The juveniles had left the scene prior to officers' arrival and the staff did not know who they were. The fire alarm was reset by the staff.

### **GIRLFRIEND/BOYFRIEND ARGUMENT**

On January 3<sup>rd</sup>, at approximately 7:14 p.m., officers were dispatched to a possible domestic situation occurring in front of the US post Office. Upon arrival, officers located the male and female who turned out to be a boyfriend and girlfriend. Both the boyfriend and the girlfriend advised that the argument was verbal only and that no physical fight had ever occurred. A LEIN check of the two revealed that the boyfriend had a warrant for his arrest out of Dowagiac for larceny and the girlfriend had a warrant for her arrest out of Clinton Township for a moving traffic violation. Both agencies advised that they were unable to pick up the two on the warrants and to advise the two about their warrants and release them. The couple was released on the scene

### **SMOKE INVESTIGATION**

On January 5<sup>th</sup>, at 7:57 a.m., Engine 3 and officers responded to the area of Lakeway and Shiawassee for a report of a heavy odor of smoke and smoke coming out of a chimney. Upon arrival it was determined that the home had a wood burning stove that was working properly.

### **OPEN INTOXICANTS IN MOTOR VEHICLE/MINOR IN POSSESSION**

On January 6<sup>th</sup>, a vehicle with a defective tail light was stopped on eastbound M-5 near Middlebelt. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The vehicle owner was seated in the back and consented to a search of the vehicle. Two open bottles of liquor (Bacardi Rum and McMasters Whisky) were confiscated from the backseat. The vehicle owner admitted to owning the bottles. The officer issued a citation to the owner of the vehicle for Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle and a Minor in Possession citation to a twenty year old passenger. The driver had not been drinking. All occupants were then released.

### **LARCENY IN A BUILDING**

On January 6<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 7:41 p.m., an officer responded to the Farmington Health Care for a report of a larceny in a building. Upon arrival the officer learned from a patient that she had an \$1800 diamond ring removed from her finger sometime while she was sleeping from January 3-4, 2012, from 11:00 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.. Farmington Health Care investigated the incident and then contacted this police department in order to report the crime. The case has been forwarded to the Detective Bureau to interview the staff that is caring for the patient.

### **HOME INVASION**

On January 6<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 7:44 p.m., officers responded to the 31000 block of Lee Lane for a home invasion report. Upon arrival officers interviewed the reporting person who advised that she is house sitting for the owner of the home who has been in the Dominican Republic for approximately one week. The reporting person advised that she had come to the home in order to feed the cat when she discovered that the rear door to the home had been forced in. Officers checked the interior of the building for a suspect and discovered that the home had been ransacked. A laptop computer was discovered missing.

### **NEVER ACQUIRED/OPEN INTOXICANTS IN A MOTOR VEHICLE**

On January 7<sup>th</sup>, an officer paced a vehicle at 40 mph on westbound Grand River through downtown Farmington. A traffic stop was conducted at Grand River and Whittaker. The

driver admitted to not having a license. The officer observed an open Bud Light beer can in the cup holder between the driver and front seat passenger. The driver admitted the beer was hers. The driver was arrested for Never Acquired and Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle and the vehicle turned over to the passenger. The driver was also cited for speeding.

### **SOLICITOR COMPLAINT**

On January 7<sup>th</sup>, at 11:23 a.m., this police department responded to the area of Marblehead and Beacon for a report of an unlicensed solicitor. Upon making contact with the person soliciting for Dewitt Construction, it was determined that he did not have a permit. The man was issued a citation and advised to obtain a permit before continuing to solicit in this city.

### **SUSPICIOUS PERSONS**

On January 7<sup>th</sup>, at 12:14 p.m., officers responded to the area of Slocum and Hayden for a report of two suspicious males; one of them on stilts, leaning on a car in the street watching cars go by. Upon arrival it was learned that the two males were drywall workers on a smoke break.

### **CUSTOMER TROUBLE**

On January 7<sup>th</sup>, at 1:11 p.m., officers responded to Ram's Horn on a report of an irate customer who was threatening to break windows. Upon arrival it was learned that the male believed that he had been shorted \$10 in his change from his bill. It was later learned that the male suffers from mental illness and that the register showed no overages. The man was asked not to return to Ram's Horn.

### **ODOR INVESTIGATION**

On January 8<sup>th</sup>, this department was contacted by a resident on Loomis Court regarding a gas leak. Upon arrival, the officers found the residence to contain a high concentration of natural gas. The residents were evacuated and the home was ventilated. A faulty furnace was the source of the leak. The gas to the furnace and residence was shut off and the scene was turned over to Consumers Power

### **DRUG PARAPHERNALIA/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On January 8<sup>th</sup>, an officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River and Halsted for improper lane use. The officer detected an odor of marijuana. A search of the vehicle yielded a plastic baggie containing marijuana residue. The driver admitted to smoking marijuana prior to driving the vehicle. The driver also had a suspended license. The driver was arrested for Drug Paraphernalia and Driving While License Suspended.

### **ASSIST OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT**

On January 8<sup>th</sup>, an officer observed an elderly female sleeping in her vehicle at the Marathon Gas Station located at Grand River and Power. The officer ran the plate/registered owner. The owner, ninety-four years old, returned as an endangered missing out of the Troy Police Department. The teletype indicated the subject had dementia. This department contacted family members who arrived at this police department to pick up same.

### **SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE**

On January 8<sup>th</sup>, at 10:04 a.m., officers responded to the Farmington Auto Wash for a report of a man claiming that he had a gun and was going to shoot somebody. Upon arrival contact was made with both the suspect and a witness, but the victim had left the scene. The suspect admitted to making the threat, claiming that he had been cut off in line three times and was angry. The witness was unwilling to sign a complaint. A search of the man and his vehicle produced no weapons.

### **ILLEGAL ENTRY**

On January 8<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 5:08 a.m., officers responded to the old Foremost Duct Building on Eight Mile Road near Farmington Road for a report of a possible breaking and entering. Upon arrival, officers met with the witness who advised that he is an employee of Venus Controls, the business next to the entered building. The witness advised that he had observed two white males exit the building and he is aware that no one should be inside. The witness then followed the two males as they drove away in a white Honda Civic towards Redford Township. The witness advised that the two men obviously knew that they were being followed because they started driving erratically in excess of 80 mph in an attempt to get away from the witness. Officers checked the empty building and noted that nothing appeared to be missing. Officers located a hole in the cinder block wall that appeared to have one time been a ventilation hole recently made larger. The investigation revealed a suspect from the West Bloomfield area who has a criminal history involving drugs and stolen property. The property manager advised that her company is not interested in pressing charges since nothing was stolen and requested that the suspect be advised for trespassing.

### **SUSPICIOUS ODOR**

On January 8<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 5:42 p.m., officers were dispatched to Whittaker Street for an odor of Kerosene. Upon arrival, officers noted a very slight odor that was quickly dissipating. Officers interviewed the reporting person who advised that he called the police because he smelled a very strong odor of the gas, but that he too noted that it was much less distinct once officers arrived. Officers were unable to locate the source of the odor.

### **FOUND PROPERTY**

On January 8<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 8:29 p.m., a resident of Farmington turned over to this department a box full of paperwork and personal items that she found on Farmington Road near Nine Mile Road. The owner of the property was located and officers attempted to contact her by leaving her a voicemail on her phone and knocking at her Farmington Oak's Apartment residence. While attempting to locate the woman at her residence, an unknown woman inside the apartment advised that the owner was not home and that she would relay the message to her. The woman inside refused to open the door or to take the property. A LEIN check of the property owner reveals that she has a warrant for her arrest out of the city of Farmington Hills for driving on a suspended license. The property was housed in the police department evidence room pending pick up from the owner.
