



WEEKLY REPORT February 6 - 12, 2012

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED THIRD OFFENSE/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE REVOKED

On February 6th, an officer conducted a traffic stop with a vehicle for improper lane use and impeding traffic at Grand River and Brittany Hill. The driver indicated he was on his way home from a Super Bowl party at the Holiday Inn (Grand River/Halsted). The officer detected a strong odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming "a lot" of alcohol during the party. The driver failed field sobriety tests and admitted to being intoxicated. The driver submitted to a PBT with a result of .32(0). The officer also located open alcohol in the vehicle. The officer arrested the driver for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). The vehicle was impounded and the driver subsequently submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .37 and .39. The driver's past Secretary of State records indicated his license was revoked with two prior OWI/OUID (Operating Under the Influence of Drugs) convictions out of Novi and Roscommon. The driver was held pending submittal to Oakland County Prosecutor's Office on charges of OWI III and Driving While License Revoked.

MINOR IN POSSESSION/CONSUMED ALCOHOL

On February 6th, at 10:15 a.m., a nineteen year old female came into the station for a court ordered PBT, part of probation for 47th District Court. The result of the PBT was .02(8). The subject admitted to officer she had been drinking the night before. The subject was arrested for Minor Consuming Alcohol, processed and her probation officer was notified.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On February 6th, a downtown business employee came into the station to report that her tire had been punctured while at work in Farmington. She had no suspects or reason why someone would have damaged her tire.

ANIMAL COMPLAINT

On February 6th, at approximately 6:00 p.m., an officer responded to Sherwood Street for a report of an animal neglect. Upon arrival the officer learned from the reporting person that one of her neighbors recently obtained two small puppies and has been leaving them out in the frigid weather. The officer noted that the two, approximately eight week old puppies, were tethered to a pole with adequate food and water. The officer made contact with the owner who admitted that she sometimes leaves the puppies outside for no more than five hours at a time. The officer pointed out the young age of the puppies and that the effects that the frigid cold would have on their bodies. The young woman was warned about neglecting an animal's care and was advised that she would be cited in the future.

SOLICITORS

On February 7th, a resident on State Street reported solicitors. An officer located two solicitors who did not have a permit to solicit. One of the solicitors was found to have a warrant out of Wayne County. Both subjects were issued violations for soliciting without a permit. The subject with the warrant was arrested and transported to this department.

IDENTITY THEFT

On February 7th a woman came into the public safety department to report that someone had used her credit card at a Wal-Mart in Connecticut. The woman advised that she was contacted by the Chase Bank fraud department who had noticed suspicious activity on her credit card. The woman does not know how her credit card was compromised and Chase Bank has reversed the charges.

STOLEN LICENSE PLATE

On February 7th an officer was dispatched to Chatham Hill's Apartments for a report of a stolen license plate. Upon arrival the officer learned from the owner that her boyfriend came home from work and noticed that the license plate was missing off of the victim's Dodge Calibri. The victim advised that she had last seen the plate on her vehicle the night before and has been driving around the area all day. The victim does not know when or where the plate was stolen.

DISORDERLY INTOXICATION/MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On February 8th, at approximately 10:20 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Basement Burger Bar for a report of a man who had just damaged the building. Upon arrival, officers located the man along with the owner and several customers outside the front of the building. The owner of the business advised that he was alerted to someone banging around items in the woman's bathroom. The owner waited outside the bathroom for the occupant to exit because he did not want to walk in on a female in the restroom. The owner observed an intoxicated male exit the bathroom and that the entire woman's restroom was in disarray and damaged. The man denied damaging the restroom and began to leave when several customers followed him and called the police. The intoxicated man denied being in the restroom to officers. The man was arrested for Disorderly Intoxication and Malicious Destruction of Property. The man submitted to a preliminary breath test with a result of .20(3) and was held until he was sober.

SUSPICIOUS PERSON

On February 8th, at approximately 10:39 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 23000 block of Hawthorne for a report of someone possibly breaking into a garage of a vacant home. Less than a minute later, officers arrived on scene to discover that the home is no longer vacant, but is being rented out.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED SECOND OFFENSE

On February 9th, an officer observed a motor vehicle parked awkward in the Crossroads Plaza located at Farmington and Nine Mile. The officer observed the vehicle to be running. The officer also observed vomit on the ground near the driver's door. The driver was asleep behind the wheel. The officer awoke the driver and detected a strong odor of

intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver admitted to drinking too much alcohol at a friend's residence. The driver began to feel ill and pulled into the plaza to vomit. The officer learned the driver was from Japan and did not speak much English. The driver submitted to a PBT with a result of .11. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. A breath test at the station revealed a BAC of .13. The driver had been convicted of OWI in Farmington Hills in 06/11. The driver was held pending warrant review on charges of OWI II by the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office.

ROAD RAGE ASSAULT/MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On February 9th, at approximately 4:09 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Nine Mile and Gill Road area for a report of a road rage incident. Upon arrival officers learned that a road rage incident had started over changing lanes at I-96 and Beck Road. The two involved drivers continued the road rage until they both exited at the M-5 and Farmington Road exit. As both vehicles approached the stop sign, the suspect blocked the victim from escaping in his vehicle, approached the victim's door, opened it and began to threaten the victim. The victim attempted to dial 9-1-1 but the suspect grabbed the phone from the victim and threw it into the car, continuing the threats. The victim was able to close and lock his doors, but the suspect began banging on the rear door, damaging the window. The suspect fled the scene with the victim following behind. Both pulled off into the parking lot of a local business and waited for police to show up. The suspect was arrested for Assault and Battery as well as Malicious Destruction of Property because he damaged the victim's rear window.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On February 9th, at approximately 10:28 p.m., an officer stopped a Chevrolet Venture for almost striking a patrol vehicle while backing in the area of Lilac and Grand River. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver's license is suspended and that she was driving with an improper license plate. The woman was arrested and charged for Driving While License Suspended.

FELONY WARRANT/FRIEND OF THE COURT WARRANT

On February 10th, an officer made a traffic stop on Grand River for a motor carrier violation. Two of the passengers in the vehicle were found to have warrants. One subject had a Friend of the Court warrant for Child Neglect and the other a felony warrant for Receiving Stolen Property. Both subjects were arrested and transported to this department and held for the Wayne County Sherriff's Department.

PAROLE ABSCONDER/WARRANT ARREST

On February 10th, officers responded to Brookdale Condominiums on a family trouble. While at the location investigating the complaint, two subjects were identified with warrants. A male subject was a parole absconder out of the Michigan Department of Corrections and a female had a misdemeanor warrant out of Redford Township. Both subjects were arrested. The female was turned over to Redford police and the male transported to this department and held for Michigan Department of Corrections.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On February 10th, at approximately 8:38 p.m., a sergeant stopped a Mitsubishi Gallant for driving after dark without any headlights on in the area of Grand River and Orchard Lake. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver was driving with a suspended license. The driver was arrested and charged with Driving While License Suspended.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On February 11th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling eastbound on Grand River with its bright lights activated. A traffic stop was conducted at Grand River and Chatham Hills Lane. The officer detected an odor of marijuana coming from the interior of the vehicle. A search of the vehicle yielded two baggies of marijuana located in the center console and backpack. Two occupants were arrested for marijuana possession and issued citations. The occupants were held pending receipt of bond money or morning arraignment.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On February 11th, an officer was conducting an apartment watch at Kensington Manor Apartments and observed a vehicle illegally parked. The vehicle was blocking three other vehicles from exiting their parking space. The vehicle had four occupants inside. The officer made contact with the driver and learned none of the occupants resided in the complex. The driver indicated he was waiting for a resident to pay him gas money. The officer detected an odor of marijuana coming from the interior of the vehicle. The officer observed a partially burnt marijuana joint on the ground near the passenger front door. The officer confiscated the joint. The front seat passenger admitted to possessing the joint and discarding it upon the officer's approach. The passenger was arrested for marijuana possession. The officer issued a citation for marijuana possession to the passenger and he was housed pending receipt of bond money or morning arraignment.

ODOR INVESTIGATION

On February 11th, at approximately 9:18 p.m., officers were dispatched to a home on Ely Court for an odor of smoke in the home. In less than one minute, officers were on the scene and discovered that a careless cook had caused the odor.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On February 12th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling at a high rate of speed eastbound on M-5 near Halsted. The officer paced the vehicle in excess of 85 mph in a 70 mph zone. A traffic stop was conducted at Nine Mile and Farmington Road. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver admitted to having three beers at the Liquor Store Bar in Novi. The driver failed sobriety tests and submitted to a PBT with a result of .18(0). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with results of .19 and .19. The driver also had six current suspensions on her driving record. The driver was issued a citation for OWI and Driving While License Suspended and held until sober.
