



## WEEKLY REPORT

### March 19 – March 25, 2012

#### **MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY**

On March 19<sup>th</sup> damage to the Sunquist Pavilion was reported. There were two holes in the drywall near the bathrooms and graffiti on the cement. The officer reported it appeared a bicycle tire made the holes in the drywall.

#### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On March 20<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 4:30 a.m., a sergeant on patrol stopped a Pontiac Grand Am in the area of Grand River and Halsted for having a headlight out. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had been consuming intoxicants and Vicodin. Field sobriety exams were administered and the driver failed them, resulting in an arrest for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). The driver submitted to a breath test with a result of .11 and .10. The driver had previously been arrested on March 10, 2012 by Plymouth Township for OWI. The driver was held till sober and is charged with OWI.

#### **BRUSH FIRE**

On March 20<sup>th</sup>, the afternoon shift was dispatched to the area of eastbound M5, near Farmington Road for the report of a large brush fire. Units responded with Engine 3 to find an electrical transformer had malfunctioned and started a fire. DTE was contacted and officers were able to quickly extinguish the fire, using about five hundred gallons of water.

#### **SMOKE INVESTIGATION**

On March 20<sup>th</sup>, the afternoon shift was dispatched to the report of smoke in a business in the 20000 block of Farmington Road. Upon arrival, officers learned that roofers were using a torch to melt tar on the roof, causing smoke to filter down inside the business.

#### **DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On March 22<sup>nd</sup>, at approximately 4:37 a.m., an officer stopped a Ford Flex in the area of Grand River Avenue and Liberty Street for speeding downtown. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver has a suspended driver's license. The driver was arrested for driving with a suspended license and his vehicle was impounded. The driver was released from the station after being processed with a citation.

#### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/RESISTING ARREST**

On March 22<sup>nd</sup>, at 11:30 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding. The male driver

immediately was irate and aggressive. The driver was highly intoxicated, pushed the officer and resisted arrest. The subject was arrested and transported to this station. A search warrant was obtained for his blood.

### **SUSPICIOUS PERSON**

On March 23<sup>rd</sup>, at 3:00 p.m., a seventeen year old reported that a male approached her on Maple Street, tried to talk to her, and then asked her to get in his vehicle. The female fled the scene and the suspect left. The incident occurred a couple hours prior to reporting it.

### **SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE**

On March 24<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 2:53 a.m., officers were dispatched to Brookdale Condominiums for a report of a subject with a ladder up to a window. Upon arrival the officers located the subject who is a resident of the complex. The officers verified the subject's identification and learned that she had locked herself out of her condominium and was using the ladder to get back inside.

### **ELECTRICAL FIRE**

On March 24<sup>th</sup>, the afternoon shift was dispatched to the 35000 block of Smithfield for the report of an odor of smoke inside the home. Units arrived to find a short in the home's wiring which caused a chandelier to melt and catch fire. Officers quickly turned the power off and contained the problem.

### **ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY**

On March 25<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 5:38 a.m., this department was contacted by the Farmington Hills Police Department requesting assistance in handling a suspicious person report. Farmington Hills officers were tied up on other runs at the time. Officers were dispatched to the Knight's Inn on Halsted for a report of an intoxicated male knocking on doors. Upon arrival officers located the male who advised that he was on a date with a woman who dropped him off at the hotel and then stranded him there. Officers called the man a taxi who took him to Five Mile and Telegraph.
