



WEEKLY REPORT

March 26 – April 1, 2012

STOLEN VEHICLE

On March 28th, at approximately 6:32 a.m., an officer was dispatched to Chatham Hills Apartments for a report of a stolen vehicle. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the victim who advised that she had parked the 2007 black Pontiac Grand Prix behind her apartment building on March 24th at approximately 4:00 p.m. The victim had not been out to her vehicle for several days but noticed it missing on March 28th. The victim advised that she is current on her payments and is the only person with a key to the vehicle. The investigating officer found no evidence at the scene and the vehicle was entered into the state computer system as stolen.

ATTEMPT TO PASS FRAUDULENT CHECK

On March 28th, at 9:50 a.m., the manager of TCF Bank reported a subject attempted to open an account with a stolen check. The suspect became nervous and fled the scene. The officer conducted an investigation and found that a number of checks had been stolen from a car the previous day in Pittsfield Township. The suspect information and bank video was provided to Pittsfield Township.

SUSPICIOUS PERSON

On March 28th an officer was dispatched to the 36000 block of Brittany Hill Court for the report of a suspicious person. A subject described as a white male, 40 years old, wearing dark cargo pants, and a white button down shirt, approached two ten year old boys playing basketball in their driveway. The subject asked the boys if their mother was home (asking for her by name). When the boys advised the subject that she was in the shower, the subject produced a gold badge from around his neck and asked if there were any other adults in the home. The boys stated "No." The subject did not provide any other information and left the area in a white, Chevrolet Impala. Area agencies were contacted. It is unclear who the subject is affiliated with.

TRESPASSING

On March 28th afternoon shift officers were dispatched to a business in the 33000 block of Grand River for a report of malicious destruction of property. Officers were advised that three teenaged girls had marked up a bathroom with a "Hello Kitty" ink stamp and had drawn over two tables with a permanent marker. Officers made contact with the teenagers who admitted to the damage. At the request of the business manager, the teens were given no trespass warnings and advised if they returned to the business, they would be arrested for trespassing. Business management declined prosecution for the damage.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On March 29th, at approximately 3:47 a.m., an officer stopped a Chevrolet Impala for speeding in the area of Grand River and Lakeway. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver has twelve suspensions on her driving record and five warrants for her arrest. The driver was arrested for Driving While License Suspended and was lodged at the Farmington jail.

CHIMNEY FIRE

On March 29th, at 10:24 a.m., officers responded to a chimney fire on the 33000 block of Shiawassee. The fire was quickly extinguished by patrol officers with no damage to the residence.

THREATS

On March 30th a subject came into this police department to make a threats complaint. A subject threatened to shoot the complainant if he did not stop dating a particular female. The suspect left threatening messages on the complainant's cell phone voicemail indicating that he did not approve his involvement with the female. The commander made contact with the suspect, who stated that he was threatened by the complainant. The suspect was advised not to have contact with the complainant and if he came to the complainant's home, he would be arrested for trespassing.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On March 31st, at approximately 2:16 a.m., a sergeant on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Halsted for straddling the fog line and having an expired license plate. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had been consuming intoxicants prior to operating her vehicle. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated. The driver was transported to the Farmington jail where she submitted to a Datamaster breath test with a result of .13 BAC.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANTS

On March 31st an afternoon shift officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River near Halsted Road for an equipment violation. Upon checking the driver through LEIN and Secretary of State, he learned that the driver had multiple suspensions on his driver's license, and a warrant for his arrest for license violations. The driver was arrested, cited and lodged at the Farmington jail.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On April 1st, at approximately 4:55 a.m., a commander checking business in the area of Orchard Lake and Shiawassee noticed a subject walking inside the rear of a dark business, well passed business hours. A subsequent investigation revealed that the business owner was in the business past hours.

KITCHEN FIRE

On April 1st units were dispatched to the 33000 of South Manor Drive for the report of a kitchen fire. Officers arrived to find the hallway and apartment in question charged with smoke. Officers made entry to the apartment to find an occupant had left bacon cooking in a

pan on the stove. The grease had ignited, starting a fire. The fire was out upon arrival of on duty personnel. Officers used fans to clear the smoke from the apartment.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

On April 1st, at 6:48 p.m., afternoon shift officers were dispatched to a business parking lot in the 37000 block of Grand River for the report of two subjects fighting. The first arriving officer arrived within seconds of the 911 call to find the two subjects on the west side of the building. It appeared as though the subjects had been fighting, but neither of the subjects was cooperative when questioned. One subject had a bloody nose but declined medical attention. Both subjects declined any police involvement. The subjects were advised that their behavior was considered to be disorderly conduct and given verbal warning. Both subjects were released.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE/WARRANT ARREST

On April 1st an afternoon shift officer was flagged down in the east lot of the Farmington Public Library. Two citizens had observed a male slap a female in the face and when they confronted him, the suspect challenged them to a fight. Upon conclusion of an investigation, the intoxicated suspect was arrested for Domestic Violence (second offense) and lodged in the Farmington jail pending a warrant presentation to the prosecutor's office. The two citizens were thanked for their willingness to help, but were advised to call 911 immediately if they observe an assault in the future.
