



WEEKLY REPORT April 2 – April 8, 2012

MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

On April 2nd, at approximately 12:30 a.m., an officer was dispatched to the area of Farmington Road and Shiawassee for a report of a hay bale blocking the road way. Upon arrival the officer noted that someone had intentionally placed the hay bale in the roadway. The officer removed the object and could not locate the subject(s) who had placed it there.

IDENTITY THEFT

On April 2nd, a female subject came to the front desk to make a fraud complaint. The subject's wallet and purse were stolen from a gym in Canton. The suspect then made two withdrawals from her bank's drive up window, pretending to be the victim.

TRESPASSING

On April 3rd, at 10:00 a.m., officers responded to a trespassing report at Heritage Condominiums. Subjects were moving into a condominium that had been foreclosed. Subjects stated they had paid rent to a friend who had just purchased the condominium. A HUD representative arrived with paperwork indicating another person had purchased the condominium and was awaiting closing. The friend who was renting to subjects was not on the scene and could not provide any paperwork. It appears someone fraudulently sold the condominium. The subjects removed their belongings and HUD changed the locks.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On April 4th, at approximately 1:42 a.m., the on duty commander stopped a Ford Taurus for speeding in the area of Farmington Road and Maplenut. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had two suspensions on his driving record from unpaid tickets out of Redford Township. The man was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was processed at the Farmington jail. The man was released with a citation and his car impounded.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On April 4th, at approximately 2:54 a.m., an officer stopped a Dodge Charger for speeding on Grand River Avenue. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had not paid a previous ticket out of Farmington which had resulted in a warrant for his arrest and a suspended license. The man was arrested for driving on the suspended license and his vehicle was impounded. The man was lodged at the Farmington jail until he was able to post the bond on the unpaid citation.

MISDEMEANOR WARRANT OTHER JURISDICTION

On April 4th, at approximately 4:57 a.m., the registered owner of the Dodge Charger from the previous Driving While License Suspended (DWLS) arrest, came to the police department to bond the male out on the DWLS charge and unpaid citation warrant. The officer involved in the previous incident knew that the owner had two warrants for her arrest out of Ferndale for \$1,000 worth of unpaid tickets because the state computer informed him of the warrants when he impounded her vehicle. The woman was arrested on the two warrants and was turned over to Ferndale Police.

AUTO THEFT

On April 4th, at 11:20 a.m., an auto theft was reported from a business on Orchard Lake. The victim advised that the vehicle (2003, Chevrolet Impala) was missing since April 9, 2012. The victim stated he allowed a subject to test drive the vehicle on that date. Upon finding the vehicle missing, the victim realized the keys returned to him were not the right keys for the vehicle.

MISDEMEANOR WARRANT OTHER JURISDICTION

On April 5th, at approximately 01:21 a.m., an officer stopped a Nissan for a traffic violation at Grand River and Grove. A subsequent investigation revealed that the man had two warrants for his arrest out of Dearborn for unpaid tickets. Dearborn police advised that they were unable to pick up the subject so he was advised of his warrants and released on the scene.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On April 5th, at 1:00 p.m., an officer took a report at the front desk of a Malicious Destruction of Property. The victim's car was keyed while parked in a municipal lot overnight. There are no suspects.

RECEIVING AND CONCEALING STOLEN PROPERTY/WARRANTS

On April 8th, at 1:00 p.m., a subject called Farmington Hills police to report his bicycle had been stolen from Busch's Supermarket on Grand River at Drake. A few hours later, the victim observed a male riding the bicycle on Grand River near School Street. The victim called 9-1-1 and officers quickly located the suspect and stolen bike. An officer interviewed the victim at a separate location, who provided extremely detailed information about the bike. The suspect stated that he was given the bike by a subject in Redford, but could not provide a full name of the subject. The suspect, who has an extensive criminal history including larceny, multiple weapons offenses and assault was arrested for receiving and concealing stolen property and lodged in the Farmington jail. The suspect also has a "no bond" warrant out of Detroit police for home invasion.

OPEN DOORS

The midnight shift located two businesses which had accidentally left their front doors unlocked overnight.
