



WEEKLY REPORT May 14 – 20, 2012

EMPLOYEE TROUBLE

On May 14th, at 10:50 a.m., officers were dispatched to trouble with an ex-employee at a business on Chesley Drive. Officers found that the employee had been fired prior and was now calling the business. They were concerned that the ex-employee may show up because he had been fired for threatening behavior.

OPERATING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF DRUGS AND ALCOHOL

On May 16th, at 4:39 p.m., an officer was advised of a potential drunk driver in the area of Farmington Road and Eight Mile. The officer located the suspect vehicle in the area of Farmington Rd and Tall Oaks. The officer observed the suspect vehicle driving erratically and made a traffic stop. Upon contact with the driver, the officer learned that he had been drinking at O'Malleys in Livonia and had consumed "two drinks". It was also learned that the subject had been taking prescription drugs which included Percocet and Fentanyl. The officer administered field sobriety tests which the subject failed. The subject was arrested for Operating Under the Influence of Drugs and Alcohol and lodged in the Farmington jail.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On May 18th, at 4:40 p.m., an officer was dispatched to a business in the 37000 block of Grand River for the report of a Malicious Destruction of Property. An unknown suspect had written graffiti on the walls of the business's bathroom.

MINOR IN POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL/POSSESSION OF FRAUDULENT ID

On May 18th, at 11:33 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding on Farmington Road at Cloverdale. Upon making contact with the two female occupants, the officer observed a six pack of beer inside the vehicle. An investigation revealed that the two female passengers were not twenty-one years old and one of the females was in possession of a false identification. The officer cited the passenger (who admitted the beer was hers) with Minor in Possession and the driver (whose picture was on the false ID) for possession of Fraudulent Identification. The beer was emptied out and the two were released with notices to appear in court.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANT ARREST

On May 19th, at 11:26 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on Farmington Road at Nine Mile for having defective equipment. During the course of the traffic stop, the officer learned that the

driver had multiple suspensions of his driver's license and numerous warrants for his arrest. The driver was arrested and lodged in the Farmington jail.

LARCENY OF AUTO PARTS

On May 19th, an officer was dispatched to a report of a stolen tailgate from a 1997 Dodge Ram at Chatham Hills Apartments. The owner believed the theft occurred between 10:00 p.m. on May 18th and 12:30 a.m. on May 19th. Nothing else was disturbed in the vehicle. An area search yielded negative results. A teletype was sent to area departments regarding the theft.

DISORDERLY PERSON/INDECENT CONDUCT

On May 19th, an officer observed a running vehicle parked in the Colonial Car Wash parking lot at 2:30 a.m. The car wash was closed. The officer observed the vehicle headlights activated and the passenger door open. The officer pulled to the rear of the vehicle and observed an occupant urinating in the parking lot. The officer also observed a cup containing tequila and cranberry juice in the center console of the vehicle. The officer learned the occupant had consumed alcoholic drinks at the Tin Fish restaurant in Novi and did not want to wet her pants. The officer confiscated the drink and poured out its contents. The officer issued the occupant a citation for Disorderly Person/Indecent Conduct and Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle and released same. The driver of the vehicle had not been drinking.

BRUSH FIRE

On May 19th, at 9:40 a.m., officers responded to a report of a brush fire against a fence at Crossings Church. The fire had been extinguished and caused damage to the fence.

CITIZEN ASSIST/DOG RESCUE

On May 19th, at 12:10 p.m., a resident on Brittany Hill requested assistance as his small dog had become trapped under his car. The officer had to crawl under the vehicle and found the small dog had crawled halfway over the exhaust pipe and become stuck. The officer was able to rescue the dog and return it to the elderly owner.

LARCENY IN BUILDING

On May 19th, at 3:30 p.m., a resident came into the station to report a larceny while volunteering at the Warner Mansion. She left her purse in a room inside the mansion and sometime over the past three days someone stole \$250 cash out of her wallet.

RECKLESS DRIVING

On May 19th, at 5:50 p.m., an officer observed two subjects riding on the roof of an SUV in the parking lot of the Farmington Board of Education. The officer stopped the vehicle and issued the driver with Reckless Driving and the two teenagers with riding on the outside of a vehicle. All three were released with notices to appear in court.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANTS/POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On May 19th, at 10:50 p.m., an officer was in the area of Grand River and Brittany Hill. The officer observed a moped with its turn signal stuck on. The officer checked the license of the moped in LEIN, and learned that the plate was supposed to be on a Harley Davidson

motorcycle. The officer made contact with the rider and learned that he had purchased the moped from an unknown subject in Detroit. The officer checked the rider in LEIN and Secretary of State and learned that he was suspended, had an arrest warrant out of the Michigan State Police. Upon searching the subject, Marijuana was found. The rider was arrested and lodged in the Farmington jail pending the posting of bond.

ASSAULT

On May 20th, a citizen reported being hit with a "slushy" thrown from another vehicle. The citizen reported travelling in her vehicle northbound on Farmington Road at Meadowlark with her window down. Another northbound vehicle passed her and threw the "slushy" through her window striking her. The citizen was able to get a plate number and the responsible party was located. The eighteen year old student denied it was intentional but an accident. The reporting officer cited the eighteen year old for throwing a projectile from a vehicle.

NARCOTIC POSSESSION/OPERATING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF DRUGS

On May 20th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling on/over the fog line on westbound M-5 near Farmington Road. A traffic stop was conducted at westbound M-5 and Halsted. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming Grey Goose vodka at his sister's residence. The driver also admitted to taking Vicodin. The driver failed field sobriety tests but refused the PBT. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and Operating Under the Influence of Drugs (OUID). The driver refused a breath test at the station and a search warrant for blood was executed. A search of the driver at the station yielded three suspected Vicodin pills from his pants. The driver was released pending blood results and warrant presentation to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for Narcotic Possession, OWI and OUID.

SUSPICIOUS PERSONS

On May 20th, at 4:08 p.m., a teacher inside Longarce School heard noises on the roof. When she went to the window she observed tennis balls and basketballs being thrown down from the roof. When she went to the door, she observed a few teenaged subjects run to a vehicle and leave east on Arundel. Officers used the ladder truck to gain access to the roof, but did not find anyone or any signs of damage.

DISORDERLY INTOXICATION/INTERFERING WITH POLICE

On May 20th, at 6:20 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 23000 block of Farmington Road for the report of an intoxicated subject attempting to drive away in a vehicle. Officers arrived to find the subject grabbing at the reporting party's arms. Officers had to use control holds and forcibly remove the subject from the reporting party. The subject would not comply with the officers verbal commands and resisted officers' attempts at hand cuffing. The subject was taken into custody and transported to the Farmington jail. At the jail the subject submitted to a preliminary breath test. The subject's blood alcohol level was .39%. The reporting party declined to prosecute the subject for assault. The subject was cited for Disorderly Intoxication and Interfering With Police. The subject was held for twenty hours (until below .08%) and released on bond.
