



WEEKLY REPORT

June 4 - 10, 2012

BREAKING AND ENTERING BUSINESS

On June 4th, at 1:30 a.m., officers responded to an alarm at Belle Tire. Upon arrival officers found the steal door to the cinder block storage building completely pulled away from the building into the parking lot with numerous cinder blocks. There was heavy damage to the doorway as well. An owner responded and determined there was old material in the building and the loss was minimal but the damage significant. Officers processed the scene and the case is under investigation.

PROPERTY DAMAGE ACCIDENT

On June 4th, an officer responded to 35103 Grand River in the Drakeshire Plaza where the former Little Caesars is being renovated. The reporting person/contractor arrived to find the front door shattered. Upon investigation it appears that a vehicle either pulled into or backed into the door. There are no suspects in this matter and it does not appear that the suspect(s) entered the building.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/FALSE IDENTIFICATION TO A POLICE OFFICER/WARRANT ARREST OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

On June 4th, as a result of a traffic stop for equipment violation, the driver was found to have a misdemeanor warrant out of Rochester Police Department for Aggravated Assault along with a Friend Of the Court Warrant out of Oakland County for Child Neglect/Support. A Secretary Of State check on the driver, showed his driver's license was suspended. During contact with the driver, he also gave false identification.

OPEN INTOXICANTS IN A MOTOR VEHICLE

On June 5th, at 2:25 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle near Farmington and Eight Mile for failure to dim bright lights. During the traffic stop the officer found an open half bottle of Crown Royal. The driver was issued a violation for open intoxicants.

SOLICITING COMPLAINT

On June 5th, officers were dispatched to the 36000 block of Grand River Avenue on a report of two males soliciting for Green Rite. Upon arrival subjects were checked and did not have a permit to solicit with the City of Farmington. Subjects were advised to apply for a permit with the City of Farmington prior to soliciting any further. Both subjects agreed to leave the area.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On June 6th, at 2:30 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on M-5 for a defective and damaged taillight (white light to rear). During the traffic stop the officer detected an odor of marijuana in

the vehicle. A subsequent search of the vehicle found two baggies in the passenger's purse. The passenger took responsibility for the marijuana but stated it was not hers, she was holding it for a friend. The passenger was arrested for possession.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED SECOND OFFENSE

On June 6th, at 4:00 a.m., a citizen reported following a drunk driver on Grand River near Drake. An officer in the area responded and located the vehicle. The vehicle was drifting in and out of its lane and the officer stopped the vehicle. The driver failed field sobriety tests including a PBT (.23). The driver was arrested and the breathalyzer tests were .25. The driver has a prior Operating While Intoxicated conviction in 2010.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANT ARREST

On June 6th, as a result of a traffic stop, the driver was found to have a suspended license along with a Fail To Appear show cause warrant for Driving While License Suspended out of this department.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On June 6th, as a result of a traffic stop on a vehicle for drifting in its lane/weaving, the driver was found to be intoxicated and was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED AND OPEN INTOXICANTS

On June 8th, at 4:30 a.m., an officer found a vehicle stopped on Farmington and Nine Mile. The vehicle did not proceed through the green light. The driver was found to be sleeping with his foot on the brake. The subject had been drinking but was not intoxicated. The subject had a suspended license for unsatisfactory driving. The subject was arrested and an open half bottle of Jagermeister was found in the vehicle.

ANIMAL COMPLAINT

On June 8th, a concerned neighbor called because of suspicious activity with a chicken coop next door. The reporting party advised that there had been four chickens in the coop and that she came outside one day and noticed that one was dead. The next day she came outside and there were two more missing. On this date, there was nothing left besides a pile of feathers from the last chicken. The owner states that an animal got to the first chicken, then she sold two of the chickens, and she assumes an animal got the last one.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED THIRD OFFENSE

On June 9th, at 2:10 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on Freedom near Halstead for speeding. The driver was found to be intoxicated. The driver failed field sobriety tests and refused the PBT. The driver was arrested and breathalyzer at station was .16. The subject has two prior convictions for Operating While Intoxicated in 2000 and 2010.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On June 9th, at 3:45 a.m., an officer found a vehicle stopped downtown in the middle of Grand River east of Farmington Road. The officer found the driver sitting in the vehicle and he stated he had too much to drink so he stopped the car and parked not realizing he was in

the middle of the road. The driver failed field sobriety tests and was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated. The breathalyzer at the station was .14.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/ACCIDENT

On June 10th, at 2:00 a.m., officers responded to Shiawassee Park for a vehicle in the river. Officers found a vehicle in the park partially over a four foot rock embankment. The vehicle was not in the river but stuck over the side. The two subjects who were in the vehicle were standing next to the car. The investigation found the male had driven into the park with the female for a late dinner. While attempting to leave, the driver backed off the embankment. The driver was found to be intoxicated and a PBT of .14. The driver was arrested and a search warrant obtained for a blood test.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On June 10th, this department was called to Drakeshire Apartments on a delayed Malicious Destruction of Property report in which a vehicle had been keyed within the past few days. The owner of the vehicle stated that his vehicle had been damaged prior over the past few months, and it occurred mostly over the weekends.
