



## WEEKLY REPORT

### June 18 - 24, 2012

#### **UPDATE: LARCENY IN BUILDING**

On June 2<sup>nd</sup>, at 2:40 p.m., officers responded to Merle Norman where a male had stolen checks from the back office and fled on foot from the business. Officers checked the area for the suspect and processed the scene for evidence.

**The suspect has been identified and is currently incarcerated on a similar incident. Detective's will be obtaining a warrant for the Merle Norman larceny.**

#### **ENTERING WITHOUT PERMISSION/DISORDERLY INTOXIFICATION**

On June 18<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 7:50 p.m., officers were dispatched to the maintenance room of the Farmington Place Apartments for a report of a man caught trying to pull phone wires out of the wall. Upon arrival officers detained the man and interviewed maintenance. The maintenance man advised that he was informed by his spouse that the suspect, a resident of the complex, was walking around the first floor wearing only shorts that exposed approximately four inches of his buttocks. The spouse believed that the man was either intoxicated or under the influence of narcotics. The maintenance man went downstairs to the first floor but could not locate the man. After checking the maintenance room the maintenance man found the suspect standing on the maintenance desk attempting to pull the telephone and cable lines out of the wall. The maintenance man detained the suspect until police arrived. Officers noted that the man appeared to be under the influence of a narcotic and the man admitted that he had taken several prescription drugs. The maintenance man advised that the maintenance room is properly signed as "Employees Only" and that residents are made fully aware of what parts of the building they can go into and where they cannot. The man was arrested for disorderly intoxication and entering with out permission. The man was housed at the Farmington jail.

#### **MINOR IN POSSESSION**

On June 19<sup>th</sup>, an officer observed a vehicle eastbound on M-5 near Farmington Road with an invalid Nevada plate. A traffic stop was conducted on Grand River near Middlebelt. The driver produced valid registration paperwork for the vehicle and blamed the error on Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver blamed the odor on an eighteen year old passenger whom he picked up at a party. The driver was transporting the passenger to his grandmother's residence in Redford. The officer offered a PBT to the subject with a result of .19(0). The officer issued the eighteen year old a Minor in Possession by Consumption ticket and released same.

### **LARCENY FROM AUTOS**

On June 20<sup>th</sup> officers were dispatched to 22845 and 23089 Violet on a Larceny From Auto report. The officer learned unknown suspects (described as white males, twenty years of age, 6'00" and 180 lbs) stole loose change and a stereo faceplate from unlocked vehicles. The suspects left on foot southbound on Violet. Area departments were notified and the vicinity searched with negative results.

### **LARCENY FROM AUTOS**

Officers were dispatched to Floral Street for reports of Larceny From Auto's. At one residence, two unlocked vehicles had been rummaged through and approximately four dollars in change had been stolen. At another residence a locked Jeep had its plastic window slashed and the radio was stolen. There are no suspects in this matter, however fingerprints found at the scene are being investigated.

### **LARCENY FROM AUTO**

On June 20<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 4:45 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the 22000 block of Violet Street for a report of a recently discovered larceny from auto. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the vehicle owner who advised that sometime between June 19<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 p.m. and June 20<sup>th</sup>, at 4:30 p.m., an unknown person had entered her vehicle and stolen her GPS unit. No signs of force were observed on the vehicle.

### **HOME INVASION**

On June 20<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 9:07 p.m., officers were dispatched to a residence in the 33000 block of Shiawassee for a possible home invasion. Upon arrival officers interviewed the homeowners who advised that their son had come home at approximately 3:00 p.m. to retrieve some clothes for a work outing when the son noticed that the rear door was wide open. When the son went inside the home he thought he had heard a noise upstairs and went to investigate. The son initially suspected that a home invasion had occurred, but when he did not locate anyone upstairs he secured the back door and left. Approximately one-half hour later the mother returned home and noted that the back door was wide open again. The mother went inside the home and noted that it appeared that her son had been recently home. Assuming that the son had accidentally left the door open she went on with her day. Shortly thereafter the father arrived home and began working outside on the home. Several hours later the father noted that his I-Pad and change jar were missing and that several items in the home had been moved. Upon further investigation with his family he noted that the rear door was actually damaged and that it appeared that they had been victimized. Officers noted that the rear door had been forced in, but that the door was several decades old so that the damage was easily overlooked. Officers checked the home for further evidence and instructed the father on how to wipe his I-Pad information clean by utilizing the "find my I-Pad" application.

### **LARCENY FROM AUTO**

On 06/21 officers were dispatched to 35521 Tall Pine on a Larceny From Auto report. The complainant reported his driver's license and Visa credit card were stolen from his locked vehicle sometime overnight. The officer reported no signs of forced entry. No suspect information.

### **LARCENY FROM AUTO**

On June 21<sup>st</sup>, another Floral Street resident came into the police department to advise that her prescription glasses had been stolen from her car.

### **WIRES DOWN**

On June 21<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 5:29 p.m., officers responded to the 34000 block of State Street for an electrical wire down in the backyard. Upon arrival officers noted that the downed wire was isolated. DTE was contacted.

### **ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY**

On June 21<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 8:06 p.m., Farmington officers assisted members of the South Oakland Narcotics Intelligence Consortium make an arrest in the City of Farmington for possession with intent to deliver prescription medication.

### **MISCELLANEOUS OUTDOOR FIRE**

On June 22<sup>nd</sup>, at approximately 7:22 p.m., officers responded to the 23000 block of Oakland Street for a possible landscaping fire. Upon arrival officers noted that a rotting landscaping timber had been smoking, but that the homeowner had extinguished it. Officers could not locate any signs of foul play and noted that the hot weather may have had a role in the fire.

### **MISSING JUVENILE/ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY**

On June 22<sup>nd</sup>, at approximately 8:47 p.m., officers were dispatched to Longacre Elementary to locate a missing juvenile. Officers were further informed that the mother of the juvenile was waiting at Drake Park and wants the officers to transport the juvenile to her vehicle so that she could take him home. The mother had reported the son missing with Farmington Hills police. Upon arrival the officers located the missing subject who was playing basketball with friends. Officers learned that the missing subject was three hours away from turning eighteen years old and that he had run away because he is moving out of the home and doesn't want to live with his mother anymore. Officers learned from the mother that the son had snuck out of the home approximately one week prior and that he knows that he will be in trouble with her when he returns. Officers explained to the mother that her son will soon be an adult and that officers will not force him to return. The mother was advised to talk to her son at the basketball courts. Farmington Hills police were advised that the missing was located and he was removed from the state computer system.

### **HIT AND RUN PRIVATE PROPERTY ACCIDENT**

On June 22<sup>nd</sup>, at approximately 10:03 p.m., officers were dispatched to Drakeshire Apartments for a report of a property accident that had just occurred in the parking lot. Upon arrival officers spoke with the victim who advised that he had heard his car alarm going off so he went outside to check on his car. When he got outside he was approached by a neighbor who advised that she had just witnessed another neighbor strike the victim's car when pulling into a parking space. The suspect then exited the vehicle and entered a nearby apartment complex. Officers checked both vehicles and noted that there was damage on both that matched. Officers went to the apartment and the suspect advised that he did not think that he had struck the car, even though he heard the car alarm go off. The suspect was written a misdemeanor citation for failing to report an accident and for careless driving.

**OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On June 23<sup>rd</sup>, an officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River and Halsted for improper lane use. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming some beers at the Basement Burger Bar. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .10(3). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. A breath test at the station yielded a BAC of .12/.12. The officer issued the driver a citation for OWI. The driver produced bond money and was held until sober.

**OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On June 23<sup>rd</sup>, an officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River and Sherwood for failing to dim bright lights. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver admitted to drinking at the Grand Tavern in Farmington Hills. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .13(8). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. A breath test at the station yielded a BAC of .13/.13. The officer issued the driver a citation for OWI. The driver subsequently suffered a medical condition and was transported by CEMS to Botsford Hospital for evaluation.
