AUTOMOBILE THEFT

On June 25th, at 8:55 a.m., a Floral Street resident awoke to find his green Eagle Talon missing from where he had parked it the night prior. There was a fresh oil spot in front of where the vehicle had been parked leading the owner to believe that it had been towed away, but for unknown reason as there was no money owed on the vehicle. There are no suspects in this matter.

GAS LEAK

On June 25th, at 12:57 p.m., officers and two fire trucks responded to Saxony Road where a landscaping company had inadvertently cut the gas main to a house while cutting shrubbery with a chainsaw. Area homes were evacuated and Consumers Energy was summoned to the scene in order to make the situation safe.

DISTURBING THE PEACE

On June 25th, at approximately 8:56 p.m., an officer was dispatched to Farmington Glen Aquatic for a violation of the noise ordinance. Upon arrival the officer noted that the club was using a public address system in order to conduct a swim meet. The swim club advised that they would stop using the system for the night.

SKATEBOARDING

On June 26th, at approximately 6:56 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the stairs of Shiawassee Park for a report of juveniles skateboarding off of the stairs in violation of the skateboarding ordinance. Upon arrival the officer located the subjects and advised them of the ordinance. The two subjects left the park without incident.

LARCENY OF LAWN EQUIPMENT

On June 27th, at approximately 4:16 p.m., a representative from the Farmington Public Schools maintenance department came into the police department to report that several items were stolen from a lawn maintenance trailer. The representative advised that the maintenance department crew had been mowing the lawn at the Board of Education near the sled hill and when they returned they noted that two weed whips and a backpack leaf blower were missing from the trailer. The maintenance crew did not see anyone suspicious in the area and they have no suspects.

LARCENY OF LICENSE PLATE

On June 27th, at approximately 6:23 p.m., an officer was dispatched to Valley View Condominiums for a report of a stolen license plate. Upon arrival the officer learned from the

victim that he had parked his vehicle June 26th at 4:00 p.m. to June 27th at 6:00 p.m. in his condominium complex and that he had just noticed the license plate missing. The man advised that the California plate was only attached with one screw but that he rarely drives the vehicle and hasn't driven it in several days. The man has no suspects.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING

On June 28th, at 1:34 p.m., an officer was dispatched to Yesterday's Coney Island for the report of employees missing money and a cell phone. As the story unfolded it turned out that one of the employees that had reported missing a cell phone was actually the suspect. That employee was confronted and returned most of the stolen money. There is a possibility that charges still may be sought.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On June 28th, at approximately 8:16 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River Avenue and Hawthorne for speeding. A check of the driver revealed that she had three suspensions on her license and eight misdemeanor warrants for her arrest. The woman was arrested for driving with a suspended license and was housed at the Farmington jail.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED, 2ND OFFENSE

On June 29th, at approximately 9:49 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Orchard Lake and Shiawassee for speeding. Upon making contact with the driver the officer noted a strong odor of intoxicants on the woman's breath. The woman admitted to consuming several shots of whiskey. The woman failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). The woman submitted to a Datamaster Breath Test with a result of a .21. The woman has a prior conviction for OWI out of Lapeer. The woman was held at the Farmington jail until she was sober.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On June 30th, at approximately 1:30 a.m., a citizen reported a possible drunk driver. A short time later an officer located the vehicle on Grand River near Gill and noted erratic driving. The vehicle was stopped and the female driver was found to be intoxicated and failed field sobriety tests. She was arrested and at the station her breathalyzer was a .16. She was also found to have warrants out of Waterford Police Department.

PERSONAL INJURY CRASH/OPERATING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF DRUGS

On June 30th, officers responded to the area of Grand River and Power for a rollover crash in the intersection. Investigation revealed that a pickup truck had swerved into the left hand turn lane and rear ended a car that was stopped waiting to turn north. The truck then lost control and flipped onto its side. The driver of the truck admitted to taking unprescribed medications and was transported to the hospital for treatment. Operating Under the Influence of Drugs charges are being sought against the truck driver.

SOLICITOR

On June 30th, at 3:07 p.m., an officer responded to Brittany Hill Drive for the report of a solicitor going door to door selling magazines and books. The solicitor was located and advised of this city's zero tolerance policy regarding solicitation without a permit. The subject

was issued a citation and transported to a local gas station to be picked up by her crew leader.

LARCENY FROM AUTO

On July 1st, at approximately 3:55 a.m., an officer patrolling Floral Park subdivision found a backpack in the middle of the road. The owner was located and contacted at the apartment a short distance away. It was then learned the backpack had been in an unlocked car parked at the apartment. Missing from the backpack was a laptop computer.
