WEEKLY REPORT August 27 – September 2, 2012

WARRANT ARREST OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

On August 27th, as a result of a traffic stop for an expired license plate, the passenger in the vehicle was found to have an outstanding warrant out of Waterford Police Department.

ATTEMPT BREAKING AND ENTERING

On August 28th, officers responded to Kensington Manor Apartments on an attempt breaking and entering. Upon arrival, officers observed heavy damage to the unit's rear patio door. The officer reported the glass to be partially separated from the door frame. Photographs were taken and neighbors interviewed. A neighbor reported hearing banging sounds at 11:00 p.m. on August 27th. No entry was gained. No suspect information.

LARCENY OF BICYCLE

On August 28th, a patron of the Farmington Public Library reported her bicycle was stolen from outside the library.

LARCENY OF BICYCLES

On August 28th, a resident in the 23500 block of Whitaker Street reported two bicycles were stolen from the driveway of the residence. Two subjects were later found at Drakeshire Apartments and identified as being responsible for the larceny of the bicycle from the Farmington Library along with both from this residence. Both subjects were arrested and the bicycles recovered.

RETAIL FRAUD

On August 28th, officers were dispatched to CVS in regard to a regular customer who had stolen a bottle of lotion. Officers arrived and viewed the surveillance video footage which showed the customer concealing the bottle of lotion in her bag. The female subject was arrested for Retail Fraud 3rd Degree.

FELONIOUS ASSAULT

On August 28th, officers responded to a report of a felonious assault that had taken place involving a baseball bat. Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim that stated she had a verbal altercation with the suspect over a gas pump. The victim stated the suspect exited his vehicle and threatened her and her son with the baseball bat. The suspect left prior to arrival of the officers.

MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

On August 28th, officers were dispatched to the 20900 block of Birchwood on a report of a picture window on a residence being hit multiple times with paint-balls. Upon arrival, officers spoke with the homeowner who stated there was no damage to the picture window and he did not see who shot the paint-balls.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANTS

On August 29th, an officer observed a vehicle at Grand River and Halsted with a cracked driver's side tail light. A traffic stop was conducted and all occupants identified. The officer learned the driver was suspended and the passenger had several outstanding warrants with other police departments. An inventory search of the vehicle yielded five small baggies of marijuana in a purse owned by the passenger. The driver was arrested for Driving While License Suspended (DWLS). The driver was processed and received a citation for DWLS and released on personal bond. The passenger received a citation for Possession of Marijuana and was housed pending morning arraignment or receipt of bond money.

CARRYING A CONCEALED WEAPON

On September 1st, a midnight shift officer stopped a vehicle for speeding on Farmington Road near Kingslane. Upon contacting the driver, it was learned that he had a warrant out of Battle Creek for operating under the influence of drugs. The driver was removed from the vehicle and patted down for weapons. An illegal switch blade was located in his pocket. The driver was arrested for possession of a switch blade and housed in the Farmington jail pending a warrant.

LARCENY FROM AUTO

On September 1st, a parishioner of Our Lady of Sorrows Church stated that someone broke out the passenger window of her vehicle and stole her purse that was on the floorboard of the vehicle. No one was seen in the area prior to the incident.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On September 2nd, at 1:45 a.m., an officer observed a vehicle swerving within its lane and out of its lane on Grand River near Drake Road. A traffic stop was conducted on the twenty-nine year old female driver who was found to be intoxicated. She admitted to drinking in Royal Oak and failed field sobriety tests. A breath test returned with a result of .13. She was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated and housed.

OPERATING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF DRUGS

On September 2nd, a midnight shift officer was on patrol on M5 near Farmington Road. The officer observed a vehicle swerving and the vehicle almost struck the patrol car. The officer stopped the vehicle and made contact with the driver. The driver was visibly under the influence of drugs. The driver was confused and could not stand. During sobriety tests, the driver fell to his knees and vomited. Community EMS was summoned for a possible drug overdose. It was later learned that the subject had smoked Marijuana a few hours prior and the driver suspected that it had been laced with another unknown drug. The driver was transported to Botsford Hospital for a blood draw and treatment.
