WEEKLY REPORT

December 10 - 16, 2012

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On December 10th, at 11:09 a.m., an officer responded to Chatham Hills Apartments and made contact with management who advised that on December 6th there were two garage door sensors ripped off that needed repair and that on this date she learned that the wires had been cut to the sensors. There are no suspects in this matter.

UTTERING AND PUBLISHING

On December 10th, at 1:30 p.m., officers responded to Comerica Bank for the report of two females attempting to pass a bad check. Upon arrival the suspects had fled the scene. Officers were able to locate the suspect vehicle from a citizen's description and as result, three females were arrested for fraudulent checks, driving while license suspended, possession of marijuana, and warrants from other departments. Child Protective Services will also be made aware of this matter since the driver's three year old daughter was in the car at the time of these crimes.

BURGLARY

On December 10th, at approximately 6:10 p.m., an officer was dispatched to a residence on Macomb Street for a report of several items stolen from an unlocked vehicle that was parked inside an unlocked garage. Upon arrival the officer learned that the victim had parked his car inside his garage on December 9th, at approximately 8:00 p.m., and when he left for work at 7:00 a.m. the next morning he noticed that several items from inside his vehicle were missing, including a telescope, binoculars and night vision goggles. The victim reported that the pedestrian door to the garage was unlocked as was the vehicle. The man reported the crime after he had returned home from work.

PERSONAL INJURY ACCIDENT/FAMILY TROUBLE/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On December 11th, at 12:15 p.m., officers responded to Grand River and Power for an accident. Upon arrival it was learned that the 'at fault' female driver had sped up the center turn lane in order to "flip off" her daughter's father with whom she just had a custody hearing with. She then lost control of her vehicle and hit another vehicle head on causing injury.

That driver had a suspended license and was arrested. The 'at fault' driver was charged with reckless driving.

HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT

On December 12th, at approximately 4:10 p.m., an officer was dispatched to a home on Macomb Street for a report of a hit and run accident. Upon arrival the officer learned that the victim had parked his car on Cass Street near Macomb over night and had discovered his vehicle damaged in the morning. The man does not know who struck his vehicle but the officer noted that there was white paint transfer on his vehicle.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On December 13th, at approximately 4:43 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a commercial motor vehicle in the area of Eight Mile Road and Farmington Road for not having a logo/identification on the vehicle as required. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and two warrants for his arrest. The man was arrested for Driving While License Suspended and was housed at the Farmington jail.

ANIMAL COMPLAINT

On December 13th and 14th, an officer responded to Shiawassee Park due to concern over coyote sightings on the Power Road side of the park.

ASSIST OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY

On December 13th, at approximately 10:46 p.m., an officer on patrol in the area of Nine Mile and Farmington Road learned that a man had just threatened the clerk of the Sunoco at Nine Mile and Farmington (in Farmington Hills) by stating that he was going to shoot the clerk. The officer noticed the man sitting in his car in the parking lot so the officer made contact with the man. The officer detained the man until he could be turned over to a Farmington Hills police.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On December 13th, at approximately 11:31 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on the exit ramp of M-5 and Halsted for speeding, 106 mph in a posted 70 mph zone. The officer approached the driver who refused to get off of his cell phone and refused to interact with the officer. The driver kept attempting to reach under his seat despite being ordered not to. The driver had glossy red eyes, slurred speech and a strong odor of intoxicants on his breath. The man was ordered out of his car several times, but refused. The man was physically removed from the vehicle and arrested for Operating While Intoxicated. The man had several warrants for his arrest and several suspensions on his driver license. The man refused to take a Datamaster breath test and a warrant was sought for his blood. The man attempted to fight with paramedics who were trying to withdraw his blood, so two officers held the man down while his blood was drawn. The man was held at the Farmington jail.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On December 15th an officer stopped a vehicle on Drake near Grand River for improper lane use. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver was returning home to Muirwood Apartments from a Christmas party in Dearborn

Heights. The driver admitted to consuming vodka at the party. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .16. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .14 and .15. The officer issued a citation to the driver for OWI. The driver was housed until sober.

LARCENY FROM AUTOMOBILE

On December 16th, at 12:00 p.m., an Arundel Street resident came in to report that unknown person(s) rummaged through their unlocked vehicle during the night and stole a broken cell phone charger.

MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

On December 16th officers responded to Larkspur and Birchwood Streets regarding two reports of malicious mischief. The Larkspur resident had ranch dressing squirted on his garage door and the Birchwood resident's home was egged. A suspect in the egging was located and promised to wash the egg off.

NOTE: This department assisted Farmington Hills Police Department by housing their prisoners while improvements were made to their cell block.

The dayshift also responded to eight medical emergency related calls for service this week.
