WEEKLY REPORT

January 14 - 20, 2013

WARRANT OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

On January 14th, at approximately 2:30 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for traveling 61 mph in a 45 mph zone on Grand River near Brittany Hill. The officer obtained a driver's license from the driver and ran him through the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN). The driver returned with a Friend of the Court Warrant out of Oakland County Sheriff's Department with a bond of \$5000. The warrant was confirmed and Oakland County advised they would pick up the driver. The driver was arrested and transported back to the station where he housed awaiting Oakland County's arrival.

CONFISCATED DRUGS

On January 14th, at 9:46 a.m., an officer responded to Big Lots at 31550 Grand River on a report of a baggie of suspected Marijuana that was found inside the store. Upon arrival, the store manager stated the suspected Marijuana was found in one of the shopping carts while they were being cleaned/checked. The Marijuana tested positive and was transported to the station to be placed into the property system.

MISSING PERSON

On January 15th, at approximately 6:31 p.m., a woman came into the police department in order to report her sixty-one year old Schizophrenic daughter as missing. The woman reported that she had last talked with her daughter at approximately 6:30 a.m. and hasn't seen or heard from her since. The woman decided to report her daughter missing since it had been twelve hours since she last had contact with her and because she knows that her daughter has not been taking all of her psychotropic medication. Officers later located the missing daughter in the parking lot behind Page's Bar and she was returned to her mother.

PERSONAL INJURY ACCIDENT (PIA)

On January 16th, at 8:57 a.m., officers responded to Ten Mile & Farmington Road on a report of a PIA. Upon arrival, officers learned that one of the drivers involved was complaining of minor pain and was subsequently transported to Botsford Hospital by CEMS for further treatment. One of the vehicles involved veered off of Farmington Road and struck a house on the east side of Farmington Road causing minor damage to the brickwork on the residence.

BREAKING AND ENTERING

On January 16th, at approximately 5:53 p.m., officers were dispatched to a report of a larceny of coins from laundry machines at the Chatham Hills Apartment complex. Upon arrival the officers met with management who advised that a commercial washer and dryer had been attacked in a locked room in the basement of one of the units. The officers inspected the damage and noted that someone had pried open the door to the laundry room and then pried open the coin boxes to the machines. Management has no suspects as to who committed the crime.

IDENTITY THEFT

On January 16th, at approximately 6:40 p.m., a resident of the Meadow's Subdivision came into this police department to report that she had been a victim of an identity theft. The woman advised that she was contacted by Verizon Wireless who asked her if she had recently purchased phones and added lines to her account. The woman had not added any new lines to her account and decided to report the incident with police.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On January 17th, at 2:56 a.m., officers were dispatched to Drakeshire Apartments on a suspicious vehicle. Upon arrival, officers observed the described vehicle parked occupied. The officers made contact with the driver who was a resident of the complex. In speaking with the occupant, the officers could smell Marijuana. The driver was asked to step from the vehicle and asked if he had any Marijuana. The driver produced a pill bottle that contained a small amount of Marijuana. The driver was arrested and transported to the station. At the station, the driver was processed by a cadet and housed awaiting arraignment.

WELFARE CHECK

On January 17th, at approximately 9:55 p.m., officers were dispatched to Grand River and Nine Mile for a welfare check of an intoxicated person. Upon arrival officers located the man who advised that he is homeless and that he needs shelter for the night (below freezing temperatures) until he can cash a paycheck in the morning. Officers transported the man to the public safety department where he was allowed to stay until the morning when he could cash his check and pay for shelter on his own.

LARCENY FROM AUTO

On January 19th, at 10:22 a.m., an officer responded on a delayed report of a Larceny from Auto that occurred in the 36000 block of Smithfield between 4:00 p.m. on January 18th and 9:30 a.m. on January 19th. The resident reported that overnight someone entered her vehicle and stole money/coins from the center console, along with an iPhone charger, Tom Tom GPS unit, and two Cubic Zirconium rings. There was no damage to the vehicle found by the owner, and nothing suspicious was seen or heard during the time period.

FIRE RUNS/WIRES DOWN

The department responded to four "wire down" runs on January 20th as a result of high winds.
