WEEKLY REPORT

April 22 - 28, 2013

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANT THIS DEPARTMENT/WARRANT OTHER DEPARTMENT

On April 22nd, at approximately 3:47 a.m., an officer observed a vehicle straddling both lanes on M-5 near Farmington Road. Upon stopping the vehicle to investigate and making contact with the occupants, it was learned that the driver had ten current suspensions on his license, one passenger had a misdemeanor warrant out of this department and the other passenger had a warrant out of Ferndale. All three subjects were arrested and transported to this agency.

NEVER ACQUIRED LICENSE/FELONY WARRANT OTHER DEPARTMENT

On April 23rd, at approximately 7:23 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding 49 mph in a 25 mph zone on Drake Road near Oakland. Upon making contact with the driver it was learned that he had never acquired a driver license and he had a felony warrant out of Flint for Carrying a Concealed Weapon. The driver was subsequently arrested and transported to this department.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANTS

On April 23rd an afternoon shift officer checked a license plate through LEIN and learned that the driver/registered owner had a suspended driver's license and warrants out for her arrest. The driver was stopped and arrested for driving on a suspended license and the warrants. There was a licensed passenger who took possession of the vehicle. The driver was lodged in the Farmington jail and held pending bond.

SMOKE INVESTIGATION

On April 24th officers were dispatched to Jamestown Apartments on a report of a smell of smoke coming from an apartment. Upon arrival, officers found that a plastic lid had fallen against the heating element in the dishwasher of the apartment. There was no damage to the apartment unit or contents of same.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On April 25th a resident of Wynset Condominiums wanted to file a Malicious Destruction of Property report regarding damage to the lawn and landscape at the condominium complex. The resident stated in the past ninety days, damage has been found to the lawn and landscape near the roadway of the complex. An officer checked the area and found that the

damage was just off the roadway and appears to have been cause by a delivery or large truck trying to turn around in the tight corner and not an intentional act.

ELECTRICAL FIRE

On April 25th the afternoon shift was dispatched to a business in the 23000 block of Farmington Road for the report of an odor of smoke and sparks from an exterior electrical fixture. Upon arrival it was learned that a neon light had shorted out and burned a hole in the exterior soffit. Power was shut off and the damage appeared to be minimal.

RETAIL FRAUD, SECOND DEGREE

On April 25th two afternoon shift officers were dispatched to T.J. Maxx for the report of a retail fraud. Loss prevention officers observed a female conceal over \$200 worth of miscellaneous merchandise and attempt to leave the store without paying. The suspect was confronted by loss prevention and detained until police arrival. The subject was arrested and transported to the Farmington jail where she was lodged without bond pending a warrant from the Oakland County prosecutor. The suspect had prior arrests for Retail Fraud.

OPEN INTOXICANTS IN A MOTOR VEHICLE

On April 27th an afternoon shift officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River near Power Road for a license plate violation. Upon contacting the occupants of the vehicle, the officer detected an odor of burnt Marijuana. The occupants were removed from the vehicle and a subsequent search revealed an open pint of whiskey and an open flask containing an unknown alcoholic beverage. The passenger stated that the alcohol was his and the driver stated that she had smoked all of her Marijuana earlier in the day. The passenger was cited for Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle and released.

OPERATE WHILE INTOXICATED

On April 28th, at approximately 2:41 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on Shiawassee near Warner after having watched the vehicle drift from lane to lane and make an improper turn. Upon making contact with the driver, an odor of intoxicants was detected and the driver admitted to drinking two beers. Following sobriety tasks and a PBT, the driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated and transported to this agency where he submitted two breath samples to the Datamaster, both resulting in .11. The driver was housed at this department until he was sober.
