## WEEKLY REPORT

June 17 - 23, 2013

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED, THIRD OFFENSE**

On June 17<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 03:13 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on Nine Mile Road near Farmington Road for speeding. The officer learned the driver had been drinking alcohol. The driver was administered and failed roadside sobriety evaluations. The driver refused to submit to a preliminary breath test and was subsequently arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). The driver was transported to the station where he refused to take a Datamaster breath test. A search warrant was obtained and the driver's blood was drawn by Community EMS. This sample will be sent to the Michigan State Police Crime Lab for alcohol content analysis. The driver was jailed until sober and released. Since the driver has two prior OWI convictions on his criminal record, the case was forwarded to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for charges.

### **CHECK FRAUD**

On June 17<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 6:45 p.m., a Heritage Condominium resident came into this police department to report a fraudulent check crime. The resident advised that two checks written for \$700 each was cashed using her checking account. The resident did not recognize the name of the person that the checks were written to but advised that her former home in Detroit had been burglarized two years ago and her checkbook was stolen at that time. The incident was turned over to the Detective Bureau.

### **MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY**

On June 17<sup>th</sup>, at 11:28 p.m., officers were dispatched to a Malicious Destruction of Property that had just occurred in the 34800 block of Arundel. The resident reported that someone had just thrown an unknown object at their front window. Officers checked the area and were unable to locate anyone. Investigation at the residence revealed that an unknown person threw a water balloon at the front window resulting in the window to crack.

### **DISORDERLY PERSON**

On June 18<sup>th</sup>, at 2:50 p.m., officers were dispatched to White Pines Health Care Center at 34225 Grand River on a disorderly former employee. Upon arrival it was learned that the employee had been terminated and was refusing to leave the premises. Officers spoke to

the former employee and she agreed to leave. The former employee was advised that if she returned she would be arrested for trespassing.

### **HARASSMENT/THREATS**

On June 18<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 5:32 p.m., an officer was dispatched to Tina's Coney Island for a report of a harassing/threatening telephone complaint. Upon arrival the officer learned from the staff that an ex-employee's boyfriend keeps calling the restaurant and making threats to the staff about what the boyfriend is going to do to the owner. The officer called the boyfriend who admitted to making the threats. The boyfriend alleges that the owner of the restaurant assaulted his girlfriend, but that she did not file a police report. The boyfriend advised that he is going to "settle" the incident with the owner, but not in Farmington. The boyfriend agreed to not ever go to the restaurant and was advised of the various penalties of acting upon his words. The owner was advised to obtain a Personal Protection Order.

### **MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY**

On June 18<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 7:37 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Jail Alternatives of Michigan (JAMS) on Grand River for a report of a client who had just destroyed a door. Upon arrival, officers learned that the suspect was unable to provide a sample and wanted to wait until he had the urge to go. JAMS staff advised the man that the business had closed at 7:00 p.m. and that he would have to return the next day. The man became irate and punched a hole through the bathroom door. The man took off from the scene, but was stopped by a Farmington Hills police officer in the Grand River and Eight Mile Road area. The man admitted to the offense and stated that he did so because he has trouble controlling his anger. The man was arrested for the offense and housed at that Farmington jail.

### **SUSPICIOUS PERSON**

On June 18<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 10:19 p.m., a resident out for a walk observed a white male hiding in the wooded area on Freedom Road near the Glen Aquatic Swim Club. Upon an officer's arrival the man was located and he admitted that he was using the bushes to relieve himself. The man was warned about urinating in public and was released on scene.

### **LARCENY**

On June 19<sup>th</sup>, at 9:24 a.m., an officer was dispatched to Chatham Hills Apartments for a larceny from storage area report. The resident reported that a bicycle and industrial fan were stolen from his storage area sometime overnight by an unknown suspect. The value of the stolen items was estimated to be \$500.

### **HOME INVASION**

On June 20<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 7:45 p.m., an officer on patrol in the Heritage Condominiums complex was flagged down by a citizen. The citizen advised that he was in the process of purchasing a foreclosed condominium and was doing his final inspection prior to closing. The citizen noticed that the front door of the condominium he was buying had been kicked in. The officer checked the building and it was noted that nothing was missing. The door was secured and the officer was unable to locate any usable evidence.

### **DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On June 21<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 4:43 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Power Road for a traffic violation. A check on the driver revealed that her driver's license was suspended and that she had a warrant for her arrest out of Ferndale. The woman was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was housed at the Farmington jail.

### **MALICIOUS MISCHIEF**

On June 22<sup>nd</sup> a resident on Marblehead reported that an unknown suspect smeared peanut butter and relish on her vehicle when it was parked in the street. The peanut butter and relish washed off and didn't result in any damage. The resident does not have any suspects.

### **TRAFFIC WARRANT/POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA**

On June 23<sup>rd</sup>, at approximately 03:37 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle on Halsted Road near Grand River Avenue for having a headlight out. The officer checked the driver and passengers through LEIN and learned one of the passengers had a warrant out of the 47<sup>th</sup> District Court (Farmington) for an unpaid speeding ticket. The passenger was arrested. During the search a small bag of marijuana was located in his pocket. The passenger was transported to the public safety department where he was processed and held for arraignment.

### **BREAKING AND ENTERING/MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY**

On June 23<sup>rd</sup>, at 7:44 a.m., a resident in the 23200 block of Orchard Lake Road reported that her storage shed had just been broken into and the suspect was fleeing on a bike from the shed. Officers responded to the scene and apprehended the suspect in front of Vitamart on Orchard Lake Road with the help of a Farmington Hills officer. The suspect was positively identified by the resident and further investigation revealed numerous items had been damaged in the backyard of the home. The resident's fence, vehicle mirror, lawn mower, weed wacker, and cable box were all damaged in the incident. The suspect was transported to the station, booked, and housed awaiting arraignment. There is no known connection between the resident and the suspect.
