WEEKLY REPORT

August 19 - 25, 2013

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On August 19th, at 9:45 a.m., an officer was dispatched to Annewood Street for the report of a large shape of a penis and testicles spray painted on the roadway. There have been other similar spray paintings in the neighborhood made by unknown person(s). The DPW was contacted to power wash the roadway.

ACCIDENTAL PROPERTY DAMAGE

On August 19th, at 12:33 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the parking lot of Judge Asset Management where two parking blocks had been damaged over the past few days. It appeared that the damage was caused by construction vehicles working on the Warner Street project.

SOLICITORS

On August 19, at 3:11 p.m., officers responded to the area of State Street and Cass for a report of two solicitors. The two females were located and advised that they were selling magazines for PS Publications and admitted that they did not have a permit to solicit. The two were issued citations and ceased soliciting.

SOLICITING COMPLAINT

On August 19th officers were dispatched to the 23700 block of Beacon Drive on a report of a black male soliciting for magazine subscriptions and being rude toward residents. Upon arrival the subject was located at Leelane and Prospect coming back from speaking with a resident. The subject admitted to selling magazine subscriptions without a permit and produced identification showing he was a resident of New Jersey. A check on the subject came back showing a Probation Violation Warrant out of New Jersey for Kidnapping with pickup only in NJ and no extradition. The subject was cited for soliciting without a permit and advised not to return until he obtains a permit to solicit in the City of Farmington.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On August 20th an officer observed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed on eastbound Grand River west of Drake Road. Radar confirmed 64 mph in a 45 mph zone. A traffic stop was conducted in the parking lot of Drakehire Apartments. The officer detected an odor of

intoxicants on the driver's breath. The driver admitted to consuming alcohol at Scores Bar in Farmington Hills. The driver was attempting to get to his residence in Drakeshire Apartments before running out of gas. The driver failed field sobriety tests and was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). The officer observed Marijuana in plain view on the center console of the vehicle and confiscated same. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a BAC of .12. The driver was housed until receipt of bond money/arraignment. The officer issued the driver a citation for OWI and Possession of Marijuana.

WIRES DOWN

On August 20th, at 7:45 a.m., an officer responded to Alta Loma Street for the report of a downed wire. Upon arrival the wire was found to be sagging into tree limbs but not to be an immediate hazard. DTE was notified.

WARRANT ARREST OTHER DEPARTMENT

On August 20th officers were dispatched to Farmington Auto (LG Auto) on a report of a subject whom had an outstanding warrant. Upon arrival officers met with Farmington Auto staff who stated they were contacted by Smart Start advising if a certain individual came in to have work done on her car, to notify police due to her having an outstanding warrant for probation violation on an Operating While Intoxicated case. Officers made contact with the female who admitted she had an outstanding warrant out of 52-1 District Court for Probation Violation. The warrant was confirmed with Novi police and the female was turned over to Novi.

WARRANT ARREST OTHER DEPARTMENT

On August 20th officers conducting an investigation on a hit and run accident, found that the driver had an outstanding warrant out of Detroit for failing to appear on a traffic offense. The warrant was confirmed with Detroit police who stated to "advise & release" on the warrant. The subject was cited for leaving the scene of an accident and advised on the outstanding warrant.

OBTAINING MONEY BY FALSE PRETENSES

On August 22nd a resident of Jamestown Apartments came to the front desk of the station to file a fraud report. The resident stated he had received a 1-911 call from a person who stated they were with immigration and stated the victim had not filed his immigration paperwork correctly and they were assessing a fine of \$2200. The caller stated the resident had to go purchase Green Dot money pack cards and load them with \$2200 to pay for the fines. The resident went to CVS and bought the Green Dot money pack cards as instructed and loaded them with the money on them. The resident became suspicious of the call and came to this department to file a report. The desk supervisor taking the complaint was able to assist the resident with contacting Green Dot and was able to recover some of the money that had not yet been used by the suspect(s).

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On August 23rd an officer was dispatched to the 21000 block of Chestnut Lane on a delayed report of malicious damage to property. Upon arrival the victim stated that sometime within

the past few days his vehicle was damaged. The victim did not see or hear anything suspicious during this time period.

IDENTITY THEFT/FRAUD COMPLAINT

On August 23rd a resident of the 32000 block of Leelane Street came to the front desk of the station to file a fraud report regarding five Verizon cell phone lines that had been opened in his name. The victim stated he does not have cell phone service with Verizon Wireless and does not know how his personal information was obtained.

SOLICITING COMPLAINT

On August 23rd officers were dispatched to the 23600 block of Wesley on a soliciting complaint involving a male trying to sell books to pay for a trip to Barcelona. Officers checked the area and found the subject who did not have a permit to solicit in Farmington. The subject with issued a citation for Soliciting Without a Permit.

SOLICITING COMPLAINT

On August 23rd officers were dispatched to the 22700 block of Violet Street on a soliciting complaint involving a male trying to sell magazine subscriptions. Officers checked the area and found the subject who admitted to selling magazine subscriptions and did not have a permit to solicit in Farmington. The subject with issued a citation for Soliciting Without a Permit.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On August 24th an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. A check on the driving status of the driver came back suspended. The driver was arrested for Driving While License Suspended and transported to the station.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANTS

On August 24th an officer on patrol made a traffic stop on a vehicle where the owner of the vehicle showed several outstanding warrants out of other departments for traffic offenses and her driver's license was currently suspended. The driver was arrested for Driving While License Suspended and the outstanding warrants. The driver was transported to the station to be held pending posting of bond.

ODOR INVESTIGATION

On August 24th an officer was dispatched to the area of Cass and Oakland Street on a report of an odor of smoke in the area. Upon arrival the area was checked and it was determined that there was a bonfire burning in the area, but could not be located.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On August 25th officers were dispatched to the area of Nine Mile and Farmington Road on a report of a possible intoxicated driver in a black Ford F-150 pickup truck. The vehicle was located leaving the 7-11 parking lot as it pulled onto northbound Farmington Road. Subsequent to the roadside investigation, the driver was found to be operating while intoxicated and was arrested.
