## WEEKLY REPORT

August 26– September 1, 2013

### **ASSIST CITIZEN**

On August 26<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 4:39 p.m., officers were dispatched to Starbucks on Grand River Avenue for a report of a homeless woman needing assistance. Upon arrival officers learned that the woman had taken the bus from Detroit in order to escape an abusive relationship. The woman stopped at Starbucks in order to seek help from the local churches. Officers attempted to locate a homeless shelter that would take the woman, but all of the shelters were full for the night. The woman stayed the night at the public safety department and sought help from HAVEN the next day.

### **SOLICITING WITHOUT A PERMIT**

On August 26<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 6:32 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the 23000 block of Violet Street for a report of a man soliciting for AT&T. Upon arrival the officer located the man who was going door to door. The man admitted that he did not have a city of Farmington permit to do door to door sales and was subsequently cited for soliciting without a permit.

### **SOLICITING WITHOUT A PERMIT**

On August 27<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 5:06 p.m., officers were dispatched to Warner-Farms Subdivision for a report of two men soliciting door to door. Upon arrival the officers located the men on Frederick Street. The men advised that they were soliciting for Sharp Home Improvement Services and admitted that they did not have a city of Farmington permit for door to door sales. One of the men had a previous criminal history for home invasion and both men were cited for soliciting without a permit.

### **ASSIST CITIZEN**

On August 27<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 8:58 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the M-5 expressway for a report of a woman walking in the median. Upon arrival the officer located the woman walking on the expressway. The officer learned that the woman had been discharged from Botsford Hospital and was walking to the Knight's Inn. The officer gave the woman a ride to the hotel and advised her of the dangers of walking on an expressway.

### **POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA**

On August 28<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 9:40 p.m., an officer on the M-5 expressway stopped a vehicle for having a faulty brake light. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had a warrant for her arrest out of the city of Wixom. The woman was detained and her vehicle searched. The search revealed four Marijuana cigarettes in the vehicle. The woman was arrested for being in possession of Marijuana and for the warrant out of Wixom. The woman was housed at the Farmington jail pending bail.

### **DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On August 28<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 10:34 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for having a faulty headlight in the area of Farmington Road and Freedom. A subsequent investigation revealed that the woman had four current suspensions on her driver's license. The woman was arrested for Driving While License Suspended and cited for the offense.

### **CIVIL COMPLAINT**

On August 30<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 4:09 p.m., officers were dispatched to Brookdale Condominiums for a report of a roommate who moved out and took items belonging to the other roommate. Upon arrival the reporting person advised that he and his roommate were moving out of the condominium complex and that his roommate had taken some of his items. The officers contacted the roommate who brought the items back. The roommate advised that the items in question were purchased by both parties and that the reporting person had stated that he was just going to throw the items away, therefore the roommate took the items. The roommate returned the items.

### **DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On August 31<sup>st</sup> an officer stopped a vehicle for a red light violation on Grand River near Brittany Hill. The driver produced a Michigan Personal Identification. The officer learned the driver had two current suspensions out of Hazel Park on her driving record. The officer arrested the driver for Driving While License Suspended (DWLS) and impounded the vehicle. The driver was processed through booking and released with a citation for DWLS.

### **LARCENY IN A BUILDING**

On August 26<sup>th</sup>, at 12:29 p.m., a Slocum Street resident came to this police department to report that her iPad mini had been stolen from her home. The resident advised that her roommate had a friend stay the night and that he was left unsupervised while the residents were at work the next day. By running the suspect's name through a database, the iPad was located at a pawn shop in Hazel Park. The suspect has yet to be located.

### **RETAIL FRAUD**

On August 30<sup>th</sup>, at 12:16 p.m., an officer responded to Detroit Vintage Sportswear where the owner reported that a seventy dollar Detroit Pistons hat was stolen the previous day. A West Bloomfield High School student confessed to the crime and is being turned over to Farmington Youth Assistance.

### **OPEN DOOR**

On August 31<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 7:26 p.m., an officer on patrol observed an open door at the

old K-Mart (Grand River and Halsted). The interior of the building was checked and nothing unusual was noted. The door was secured and the property manager was advised.

**SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE**

On September 1<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 10:07 p.m., officers were dispatched to Chatham Hills Subdivision for a report of a woman screaming. Upon arrival officers spoke with the reporting person who advised that she heard a woman screaming in horror three separate times in the area of Briar Ridge and Smithfield. Officers checked the area for forty minutes but could not determine where the screams came from or who was screaming.
