## WEEKLY REPORT

September 30 – October 6, 2013

### **RECOVERED STOLEN AUTO**

On September 30th, at 9:56 a.m., an officer responded to Lansbury Street where a Harrison Township woman had located her car that had been stolen the night before. The woman advised that she had met a man at the Lions game the previous day and invited him back to her apartment. At some point the man took the woman's keys and drove off with her car. She reported the car stolen, but when he told her where it was, she decided not to prosecute the man.

### **ACCIDENTAL PROPERTY DAMAGE**

On September 30th, at 11:06 a.m., an officer responded to the Grand River/Orchard Lake Valero for a report of a vehicle that had driven off while the gas pump was still in her vehicle. The woman returned and spoke with management but left the scene prior to the officer's arrival.

### **SOLICITOR COMPLAINT**

On September 30th, at 1:58 p.m., officers responded to Fleming Street for a report of two males distributing handbills. The males were located and cited for distributing handbills for 'All Seasons Construction' without a permit.

### **MALICIOUS MISCHIEF**

On October 1<sup>st</sup>, at 1:20 p.m., an officer responded to the gazebo on Grand River near Bellacino's for the report of malicious mischief. Upon arrival the officer found there to be a letter "L" and a number "2" spray painted on a picnic table. There are no suspects in this matter.

### **DISTURBING THE PEACE**

On October 1<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 7:41 p.m., officers were dispatched to an apartment complex for a report of neighbor trouble. Upon arrival the officers learned that the

complainant had a verbal altercation with his neighbor when she began banging on her floor and yelling at him to turn down his music. The complainant went to his neighbor's apartment in order to talk to her about the noise and an argument ensued. The neighbor ended up chasing the complainant back to his apartment during the argument. Officers learned from the neighbor that she became upset when the complainant began playing his music at an unreasonable level. Both parties were advised to contact the police instead of confronting each other when they feel that the other party has become too loud.

### **FIRE RESPONSE**

On October 2<sup>nd</sup>, at 10:36 a.m., officers and Engine 3 responded to Cromwell Chiropractic for the report of an electrical fire. Upon arrival staff advised that the air conditioning fuse box had sparked and that the fire was extinguished. A scan with the thermal imager determined that there was no fire extension.

### **FAMILY TROUBLE**

On October 2<sup>nd</sup>, at approximately 6:10 p.m., officers handled a family trouble between a separated husband and wife.

### **BREAKING AND ENTERING**

On October 3<sup>rd</sup> officers responded to an alarm at China Merchandise located at 34701 Grand River. The alarm showed back door motion. Upon arrival officers located a kicked in rear door. The owner responded and noted nothing missing except a \$300 cash register. The register is believed to contain less than \$100. The video system within the business was not working. Boot prints on the rear door were photographed and the case was turned over to the Detective Bureau.

### **BREAKING AND ENTERING**

While investigating a breaking and entering at an adjacent business, officers observed the rear door to the Re-Sell It shop (34769 Grand River) to be kicked in. Officers noted the business to be vacant. Unable to contact a key holder/owner, the officers were unable to determine if anything was stolen. The incident was documented and the landlord contacted. No suspect information.

### **EMBEZZLEMENT**

On October 3<sup>rd</sup>, at 9:06 a.m., the owner of Chicken King came to this department after becoming suspicious about a couple of receipts showing negative sales. After reviewing his surveillance video, he saw that his general manager had been coming into the restaurant after hours and stealing money from the cash registers. The employee has been terminated and the matter has been turned over to the Detective Bureau.

### **DOMESTIC ASSAULT**

On October 4<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 8:36 P.M., officers handled a domestic assault. One person was arrested.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On October 5<sup>th</sup> an officer conducted a traffic stop with a vehicle with a defective headlight on

Orchard Lake Road near Lamar. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver admitted to having one alcoholic drink and a shot at Tom's Oyster Bar in Royal Oak. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .11. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a BAC of .12. The officer issued the driver a citation for OWI. The driver was held until sober and released on bond.
