WEEKLY REPORT

October 21 - 27, 2013

UNLAWFUL DRIVING AWAY OF AN AUTOMOBILE

On October 22nd an officer was dispatched to Farmington West Apartments (32777 Grand River) on a vehicle theft report. Upon arrival the officer learned the reporting party's Cadillac STS was stolen between 11:00 p.m. on the October 21st and 9:00 a.m. on October 22nd. The vehicle was parked in front of the reporting party's unit. The vehicle was subsequently located by "On Star" in Harrison Township, Ohio, and turned over to the owner.

THREAT REPORT

On October 22nd an officer was dispatched to Chatham Hills Apartments (36281 Grand River) on a threat report. Upon arrival the reporting party reported receiving a call from an unidentified caller allegedly from the State Department requesting the reporting party's credit card information or face deportation. The reporting party did not provide any personal information to the caller.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On October 23rd officers were dispatched to Orchard Lake Road and Leelane on a report of an accident. Upon arrival officers detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the nineteen year old at fault driver. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .10. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .12. The driver was cited for OWI and housed pending arraignment.

HOME INVASION

On October 23rd officers were contacted by the homeowners of 23020 Farmington Road regarding a breaking and entering. Upon arrival officers observed the front door kicked in. Officers also observed three drawers emptied and thrown on the master bedroom floor. The officers learned the deaf homeowners went to bed around 11:30 p.m. on October 22nd. A homeowner awoke at approximately 3:30 a.m. and discovered the break in. The suspects stole jewelry from the master bedroom. A canine searched the area with negative results. Evidence was collected and photographs taken. The case was turned over to the Detective Bureau.

LARCENY

On October 23rd a tenant of Jamestown Apartments (23971 Jamestown) reported the theft of \$350 from her purse by two employees of Bright House who were servicing her unit. The employees were identified and the case was turned over to the Detective Bureau for follow up.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING

On October 23rd, at approximately 6:13 p.m., a resident of Chatham Hills Apartments came into the public safety department to report a theft that had occurred at her apartment. The complainant advised that she had been out of town for a couple of weeks and when she returned, she noticed several items missing from her apartment. The complainant suspects that her twenty year old son stole the items from her while she was gone because he has stolen items from her in the past. The case has been forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On October 25th an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding on Grand River near Power Road. The officer detected an odor of Marijuana coming from the interior of the vehicle. A vehicle search was initiated. The officer located a small amount of Marijuana in the center console of the vehicle. The driver was arrested for Possession of Marijuana and the vehicle was impounded. The driver received a citation for Possession of Marijuana and was housed pending arraignment.

WARRANT ARREST OTHER JURISDICTION

On October 25th, at approximately 4:59 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Mobil gas station at Grand River and Drake for a report of a semi-conscious male sitting inside a grey Chrysler. Upon arrival the officers located the man's vehicle parked at the gas pump and noted that he was asleep at the wheel. Officers woke the man who advised that he had recently been released from a residential treatment center for drug abuse and was unaware that he had fallen asleep. A warrant check of the man revealed that he has a warrant for his arrest out of the city of Warren for retail fraud. The man was arrested on the warrant and turned over to Warren police.

HARASSING TELEPHONE CALLS

On October 25th, at approximately 8:16 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the Zap Zone on Grand River Avenue for a report of a male subject continually calling the business throughout the day. Upon arrival the officer learned that the suspect was continually calling to "warn" staff that a trouble making customer might be showing up sometime that day. The officer called the suspect and noted that he appeared to have special needs. The suspect was warned against harassing Zap Zone staff and told to stop calling.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 26th, at approximately 5:48 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Whitaker for having an unrestrained six year old in the back seat. Further investigation revealed that the driver has a suspended license and two traffic warrants for her arrest out of Livonia and Redford. The woman was arrested for driving on the suspended

license and the child was turned over to his grandmother. The woman was housed at the Farmington jail pending arraignment.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On October 27th an officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River near Halsted for speeding. The officer detected an odor of Marijuana coming from the vehicle. A vehicle search was conducted which located two baggies of suspected Marijuana in the vehicle. The Marijuana was confiscated and the vehicle was impounded. The driver was arrested for Possession of Marijuana and housed pending arraignment.
