WEEKLY RECAP

August 3 – August 9, 2015

ILLEGAL DUMPING

On August 3rd at approximately 1:45 AM an officer on patrol observed an abandoned refrigerator dumped onto the middle of Chesley Dr. It is unknown who dumped the refrigerator onto the roadway but officers removed the door for safety and moved it to the side of the road so that the DPW could dispose of it in the morning.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On August 3rd at approximately 2:47 PM an officer on patrol stopped a car in the area of Farmington Rd and Nine Mile for having an unbuckled child and for a vision obstruction. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license. The driver was arrested for driving on a suspended license and processed at the Farmington Jail.

COUNTERFEIT

On August 4th at approximately 4:23 PM a Farmington business owner came into the police department to report that one of her employees had accepted a twenty dollar bill from a customer on 08/01/2015. The owner advised that her business does have video of the suspect. The case was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

RESIST ARREST / DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On August 4th at approximately 11:55 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Power because of an improper license plate violation. As the officer was approaching the vehicle the driver exited the vehicle and started to walk away from the officer. The officer confronted the subject who refused to comply with the officer. The driver admitted to not having a valid driver's license and when the officer attempted to take her into custody she began pulling away from the officer and actively resisting him. The officer was able to place the driver into handcuffs and secure her into the rear of his vehicle. The driver has a suspended license as well as warrants for her arrest for assault and delivering marijuana out of various jurisdictions. The woman has a criminal history for resisting arrest. The woman was housed at the Farmington Jail.

EMBEZZLEMENT

On August 5th at approximately 9:53 AM a Farmington business owner came into this police department to report that his company has been a victim of an embezzlement. The business owner advised that his son is an employee of the business and has charged over \$22,000 on the business credit card for items at the Home Depot. The business owner advised that the items bought were to improve the son's personal home and not for business items. The business owner wants to press charges and the case was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

MISSING PERSON

On August 5th at approximately 7:34 PM a Cass Ave resident came into the police department to report that his elderly wife had walked away from the home 45 minutes prior and had not returned. Officers located the elderly woman at a nearby nursing home.

MISDEMEANOR WARRANT OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On August 6th at approximately 8:35 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Nine Mile and Farmington Rd for having illegal window tint. Further investigation revealed that the driver had two warrants for her arrest out of a nearby city. The police agency holding the warrants was contacted but they advised that they were unable to pick up the woman on the warrants. The woman was advised about her warrants and released.

CRUELTY TO ANIMALS

On August 6th at approximately 2:19 PM an officer was dispatched to a residence on Sherwood Ave for a report of a cat shot by a BB gun. Upon arrival the officer learned from the cat owner that her cat had come home the previous day and had been walking oddly. The woman took her cat to the vet and learned that it had been shot with a BB pellet to the side of the neck. The case was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

TRESPASS ORDER ISSUED

On August 7th at approximately 5:53 PM officers were dispatched to the 22700 block of Orchard Lake Rd for a report of a verbal altercation between a business owner and a delivery truck driver. Upon arrival the officers learned from the complainant that a delivery truck had parked in front of her business, blocking the entrance and egress, while the driver attempted to deliver stock items to the business next door. The complainant pointed out to the driver that he is blocking her business but she made an obscene gesture and continued unloading his truck. The complainant advised that she was going to call the police so the man moved his truck. The woman doesn't want the man on her property anymore so he was served with a no trespass order.

CIVIL MATTER

On August 8th at approximately 1:24 PM an officer was dispatched to a business at the 31500 block of Grand River for a report of a harassment. Upon arrival the officer learned from the complainant that he is a business owner who had recently purchased a large quantity of overstock from an independent supplier. Upon receiving the merchandise, the complainant noted that the quality of the items were not as promised and that the supplier did not deliver the correct amount of merchandise. The complainant stopped paying the supplier for the items so the supplier began showing up at the business and making veiled threats. The

supplier was contacted and advised that he would have to pursue his complaint through civil legal remedies and not harass the business owner.

IDENTITY THEFT

On August 9th a Tall Oaks St Resident came into the Police Department to report that someone had charged approximately \$400 to her credit card without her permission. The complainant suspects that her credit card numbers were stolen by a waiter the last time that she went to a restaurant. The suspect's information was verified and the case was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Note: Officers had responded to 15 medical calls this week and 5 traffic crashes.
