WEEKLY RECAP

August 24 – August 30, 2015

MISDEMEANOR WARRANT OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On August 24th at approximately 1:58 PM a Sergeant on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Farmington Rd and Nine Mile for failing to yield to traffic. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had a warrant for his arrest out of another police agency. The other police agency declined to pick up the driver so he was advised of his warrant and released on scene.

ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On August 24th at approximately 2:42 PM this department was contacted by the Las Vegas Metro Police requesting assistance in investigating a fraud complaint. The assigned detective learned that the Las Vegas victim had wired money to a possible Farmington resident who had promised her a modeling job in Detroit. The victim never heard back from the suspect after the money was sent via MoneyGram. The detective learned that the suspect does not live in Farmington anymore and further learned that the victim will not travel to Detroit to press charges.

On August 26th at approximately 7:08 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Smithfield for a defective equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a misdemeanor warrant for her arrest out of another police agency. The other police agency declined picking up the driver so she was advised of her warrant and released.

SOLICITORS

On August 26th at approximately 3:42 PM an officer on patrol observed two subjects conducting door to door sales in the area of Shiawassee and Prospect. The officer confronted the two and learned that they had a solicitor's permit out of the City of Farmington Hills. The two subjects were educated on Farmington's boundaries and warned about soliciting in Farmington without a Farmington Permit.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On August 27th at approximately 2:21 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River Ave and Power for a defective equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and two warrants for his arrest. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and housed at the Farmington Jail.

NON-SUFFICIENT FUNDS CHECKS

On August 27th at approximately 2:48 PM an officer was dispatched to a credit union on the 31700 block of Grand River Ave for a fraud report. Upon arrival the officer learned that a subject had written two checks to herself using an account from another bank and cashed them at the credit union. After several days, both checks were returned by the other bank to the credit union advising that both checks did not have sufficient funds in the accounts. The credit union attempted to contact the woman who cashed the checks, but she never answered their calls. The case was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

JUVENILE COMPLAINT

On August 28th at approximately 9:02 AM officers were dispatched to a business on the 33200 block of Grand River Ave for a report of a possible assault. Upon arrival officers met with the complainant who advised that he had observed a teenager carrying a skateboard who was trespassing on the complainant's business property. The complainant attempted to grab the teen's skateboard but the teen pushed the complainant's arm away and took off running. The complainant advises that he has caught teens skateboarding on his business roof as well as the pizza restaurant next door. In addition the complainant has had nails put into his car's tires that he suspects comes from the teens that he has escorted off of his property. An area check for the teen was unsuccessful.

GO-CART THEFT

On August 29th at approximately 1:48 PM an officer was dispatched to the 21300 block of Larkspur for a report of a Go-Cart theft. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the complainant who advised that he had parked his disabled go-cart on the north side of his home the night before and then noticed the vehicle gone this morning. The complainant advises that the go-cart is inoperable and does not know who may have stolen it.

LARCENY FROM AUTO

On August 30th at approximately 9:34 AM officers were dispatched to a church on the 21300 block of Farmington Rd for a report of a larceny from auto. Upon arrival officers spoke with the victim who advised that she had parked her vehicle in the church parking lot at 8:30 AM to attend mass, when she returned to her vehicle she discovered the passenger window smashed out and her purse missing. The case was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

LARCENY OF LICENSE PLATE

On August 30th at approximately 8:42 PM an officer was dispatched to the 23700 block of Orchard Lake Rd for a report of a stolen license plate. Upon arrival the officer learned that

the victim last saw the license plate on her car on August 27th and then noticed it missing on today's date. The victim has no suspects.
