### SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

#### Fraud

On November 16<sup>th</sup> a resident from the 31000 Block of Grand River reported they were a victim of fraud. The resident reported that a personal check was cashed at a local bank without their consent. Investigation revealed that the suspect was also a victim and was forced to cash the check. The original victim declined to pursue charges and the case was closed.

#### Attempt UDAA

On November 17<sup>th</sup> a resident from Farmington Oaks Apartments called to report a larceny from auto LFA; however, investigation revealed that the incident was actually an attempt to steal the vehicle. The resident was alerted by his car alarm and when he checked on his vehicle the suspects fled the area. The suspects were unsuccessful with stealing the vehicle, and the incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

#### Identity Theft

On November 7<sup>th</sup>, a resident from Kensington Manor Apartments reported that they were a victim of ID Theft. The resident reported that two bank accounts were opened in their name without their permission. The accounts were closed before the suspect could withdraw any money; therefore, the victim did not lose any money.

#### MDOP

On November 8<sup>th</sup>, a resident from the 34000 block of Oakland Street reported that their political sign was damaged sometime overnight. No suspect information was provided; therefore, the report was written for documentation.



**Reckless Driving**

On November 18<sup>th</sup>, Farmington Public Safety responded to the 22000 block of Frederick on a report of a white BMW speeding back and forth on the roadway. Officers responded and checked the area; however, the vehicle was not located.

**Trespass Complaint**

On November 18<sup>th</sup>, Farmington Public Safety responded to the Dollar General on a report of a disorderly customer. Upon arrival, the manager of Dollar General reported that a customer was belligerent by yelling and swearing at the cashier. At the request of the manager, the customer was advised to leave the business and not return.

**Uttering and Publishing**

On November 21<sup>st</sup>, a resident from the 23000 block of Cass reported that they were the victim of a check fraud. Investigation revealed that an unknown suspect stole a check from their mailbox, changed the payee's name and the amount to \$4000 then cashed the check at a local bank. The case was turned over to the Secret Service for further investigation.

**Missing Person**

On November 20<sup>th</sup>, Farmington Public Safety responded to Zap Zone on a report of a lost two-year-old. Officers checked the business with employees and were successful in locating the child in the upstairs portion of the building. The child was then returned to their parents on scene.
