SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Suspicious Circumstances

On November 7th a resident from the 23000 block of Warner reported a suspicious person in their backyard. An area check was conducted. The subject was located and identified as a neighbor. No crime was committed.

Identity Theft

On November 7th, a resident from Kensington Manor Apartments reported that they were a victim of ID Theft. The resident reported that two bank accounts were opened in their name without their permission. The accounts were closed before the suspect could withdraw any money; therefore, the victim did not lose any money.

MDOP

On November 8th, a resident from the 34000 block of Oakland Street reported that their political sign was damaged sometime overnight. No suspect information was provided; therefore, the report was written for documentation.

Fire Alarm

On November 8th, Farmington Public Safety responded to a fire alarm in the 33000 block of Grand River. Investigation revealed there was no active fire and that the alarm was set off due to burnt food.

Distribution of Cocaine

On November 10th, an investigation on the 30000 block of Shiawassee led to the arrest of a 37-year-old black male for the distribution of Cocaine. The male was arrested and the case was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.



Fire Alarm

On November 10th, Farmington Public Safety responded to a fire alarm in the 32000 block of Marblehead. Investigation revealed that there was no fire and that the alarm was the result of a faulty alarm.

Fire Alarm/CO Detector

On November 11th, Farmington Public Safety Department responded to the 33000 block of Tall Oaks on a report of a Carbon Monoxide detector alarm. Investigation revealed there was no CO in the residence and that the alarm was caused by low batteries in the detector.

OWI and Weapons Offense

On November 13th a traffic stop led to the arrest of a 28-year-old black male for operating while intoxicated. Further investigation revealed that the driver was also carrying a firearm under the influence. The driver was issued a citation for both offenses and released once sober and below the legal limit.
