NEW BUSINESS:

33218 Oakland: Several commissioners expressed concern about all the work being done on the house at 33218 Oakland, including reinforcing the foundation, electrical, plumbing and heating without any permits being displayed. Further concern was raised about the complete demolition and replacement of the front porch without any notification to the Historical Commission for plan review. Chairperson Myers will raise the issue with the building department.

It was suggested that the commission reinstitute a welcome letter to new residents of the Historic District explaining the process for outdoor renovations to their dwellings.

It was pointed out that several of the signs at the entrances to the Historic District are in very poor condition. Chairperson Myers will ask Commissioner Harrison to look into the matter.

Motion by Munter, supported by Baessler that, due to the Thanksgiving holiday on Thursday, November 26, the regular meeting of the Historical Commission be changed to Thursday, December 3 at 7:30 PM. Motion carried: all ayes.
